

The general effect of the Order will be to:

- (a) designate a doctor's parking place on the highway specified in column 1 of the Schedule to this notice;
- (b) provide that:
- (i) a vehicle displaying a permit issued under the Order may be left in the parking place;
 - (ii) the parking place will be in operation between 8 a.m. and 8 p.m. on any one day of the week;
 - (iii) a permit may be issued by the London Borough of Islington on application being made by certain legally qualified medical practitioners. (NOTE—a permit in respect of the parking place on the highway specified in column 1 of the Schedule to this notice will be issued only in connection with the medical practice specified in relation thereto in column 2 of the said Schedule); and
 - (iv) the charge in connection with the issue of a permit will be £84 in respect of the parking bay and that the permit will be valid for a period of 12 months.

LONDON BOROUGH OF LEWISHAM

The Lewisham (Waiting and Loading Restriction) (Amendment No. 2) Traffic Order 1991

Notice is hereby given that Lewisham Borough Council, on 11th November 1991, made the above-mentioned Order under sections 6 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended by section 8 and Part I of Schedule 5 to the Local Government Act 1985.

The general effect of the Order will be further to amend the Lewisham Waiting and Loading Restriction Order 1990, that waiting by vehicles (otherwise than for the purpose of delivering or collecting goods or loading or unloading a vehicle) will be prohibited:

- (a) at any time in the lengths of streets specified in Schedule 1 to this notice;
- (b) between 11 a.m. and 12 noon on Mondays to Fridays inclusive in the length of street specified in Schedule 2 to this notice.

A copy of the made Order, which will come into operation on 18th November 1991, and the Lewisham (Waiting and Loading Restriction) Order 1990 and a plan can be inspected (or obtained) during normal hours on Mondays to Fridays inclusive until the end of 6 weeks from the date on which the Order was made at the Development Services Section, Directorate of Environmental Services, Deptford Town Hall, New Cross Road SE14 6AE, Tel. may, within 6 weeks of the date on which the Order was made, make application for the purpose to the High Court.

SCHEDULE 1

Bromley Hill, between the eastern wall of No. 11 Bromley Hill and its junction with Glenbow Road except so much of the Service Road fronting Nos. 17A to 55 Bromley Hill as lies between a point opposite the party wall of Nos. 53 and 55 Bromley Hill.

Flimwell Close, north-west side, between a point 18.2 metres of its junction with Bromley Hill and a point 12 metres north of that point.

SCHEDULE 2

Wydeville Manor Road:

- (a) the northernmost east to west arm, the southernmost east to west arm, the north to south arm, the north, east and south sides.

London Borough of Merton (Free Parking Places) (Disabled Persons) (No.) Traffic Order 1991

Alexandra Road, Wimbledon; Cavendish Avenue; Farm Road, Morden; Fortescue Road; Green Lane, Morden and Vectis Road

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the London Borough of Merton, under the powers conferred by section 6 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, propose to make the above-mentioned Order. The general effect of the Order will be to:

- (a) designate a single parking place in Alexandra Road, Wimbledon; Farm Road, Morden; and Green Lane, Morden, in which vehicles authorised by the Order may be left for any period during the permitted hours without charge;
- (b) provide that the parking places will operate between 8.30 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. on Mondays to Saturdays inclusive (Christmas Day, Good Friday and Bank Holidays excepted);
- (c) specify, in respect of the parking places, that disabled persons' vehicles displaying in the relevant position a disabled person's badge (commonly referred to as "the Orange Badge") issued by any local authority under the provisions of the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) Regulations 1975 or 1982 may be left therein; and
- (d) provide that certain vehicles may wait in the parking places in certain circumstances e.g. to allow persons to board or alight (maximum 2 minutes), to load or unload (maximum 20 minutes), etc.
- (e) revoke the parking places opposite 3 Cavendish Avenue; 65 Fortescue Road; and 36 Vectis Road.

Nothing in the Order shall apply to anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police constable in uniform.

A copy of the proposed Order, of the Merton (Free Parking Places) (Disabled Persons) (No. 1) Order 1977 (and of the Orders which have amended or applied that Order) and of the Council's statement of reasons for proposing to make the Order and a map which indicates each length of road to which the Order relates can be inspected during normal office hours on Mondays to Fridays inclusive until 15th December 1991, at the Main Reception, Crown House, London Road, Morden.
