- (2) If a vehicle is left in a parking place in contravention of any of the provisions of this Order a person authorised by the Council on that behalf may remove the vehicle from that parking place or arrange for such removal.
- (3) For the purpose of meeting the requirements of an emergency, a person authorised on that behalf by the Council or a Police Constable in uniform may alter or cause to be altered the position of a vehicle in a parking place or remove or arrange for the removal of a vehicle from a parking place.
- (4) Any person altering or causing the alteration of the position of a vehicle by virtue of paragraph (1) of this Article or removing or causing the removal of a vehicle by virtue of paragraphs (2) or (3) of this Article may do so by towing or driving the vehicle or in such other manner as he may think reasonably necessary to enable the position of the vehicle to be altered or the vehicle to be removed.
- (5) Any person removing or arranging the removal of a vehicle by virtue of paragraphs (2) or (3) of this Article shall make such arrangements as he considers to be reasonably necessary for the safety of the vehicle in the place to which it is removed.
- (6) Any vehicle removed by virtue of paragraphs (2) or (3) of this Article will be disposed of in accordance with the Removal and Disposal of Vehicles Regulations 1986 and charges levied for the removal, storage and disposal thereof will be in accordance with the Removal, Storage and Disposal of Vehicles (Prescribed Sums and Charges etc) Regulations 1989 as amended.
- Where in a parking place signs are erected or surface markings are laid for the purpose of:
  - (a) indicating the entrance to or exit from the parking place,
  - (b) indicating that a vehicle using a parking place shall proceed in a specified direction within the parking place.
  - No person shall drive or permit to be driven any vehicle:
  - (i) so that it enters the parking place otherwise than by an entrance or leaves the parking place otherwise than by an exit so indicated or (ii) in direction other than so specified.
- No person shall except with the permission of a person authorised by the Council on that behalf drive or permit to be driven any vehicle in a parking place for any purpose other than the purpose of leaving that vehicle in the parking place in accordance with the provisions of this Order or for the purpose of departing from the parking place.
- In a parking place no person shall:
  - (1) erect or cause or permit to be erected any tent, booth, stand, building or other structure without the written consent of the Council; (2) light or cause or permit to be lit any fire.
- 15 No person shall use a parking place or any bay within a parking place when the Council have closed that parking place or parking bay.
- 16. The driver of a vehicle shall not permit that vehicle to be parked in an area where "No Parking" signs are erected or marked out on the
- The driver of a vehicle shall not permit that vehicle to be parked so unreasonably as to obstruct as to prevent access to any other parking place parking bay or any other premises adjoining the parking place or so as to become a nuisance to any other user of the parking place.
- (1) Any personwho contravenes the provisions of any Article of this Order shall pay an excess charge of Twenty Five pounds (£25) which Excess Charge will be reduced to Fifteen Pounds (£15) if paid within 14 days of the issue of an Excess Charge Notice.
  - (2) In the case of a vehicle in respect of which an excess charge may have been incurred, it shall be the duty of a Parking Attendant to attach to the vehicle in a conspicuous position a notice which shall include the following particulars:
  - (a) the registration mark of the vehicle or, where the vehicle is being used under a trade licence, the number of the trade plate carried by the vehicle;
  - (b) the time at which he first observed that the initial period for which payment was made by the initial charge had expired;
  - (c) a statement that the excess charge of Twenty Five Pounds (£25) which Excess Charge will be reduced to Fifteen Pounds (£15) if paid within 14 days of the issue of an Excess Charge Notice;
  - (d) The manner in which, and the time within which the excess charge should be paid; and
  - (e) a statement that it is an offence under section 35(4) of the Act for the driver of a vehicle who has left the vehicle in a parking place to fail to pay the excess charge.
  - (3) When a notice has been attached to a vehicle in accordance with any of the foregoing provisions of this Order no person other than a person authorised by the Council in that behalf or the driver or a person authorised by the Council in that behalf or the driver or a person authorised by the driver in that behalf shall remove the notice from the vehicle.

# Part III

### General Provisions

- 19. No person shall use a vehicle while it is in a parking place in connection with the sale of an article to persons in or near the parking place or in connection with the selling or offering to hire of his skill or services.
- No person shall use any part of a parking place as an "Operating Centre", within the meaning of the Transport Act 1968, unless the prior written consent of the Council in the form of a licence has been granted.
- 21. No person shall deposit or cause to be deposited any advertising handbills leaflets or circulars on any vehicle left in a parking place.

#### PART IV

#### Penalty

- 22. (1) Any person who contravenes the provisions of an Article of this Order or fails to pay any charge thereunder shall pursuant to section 35(4) of the Act be liable on summary convition to a fine not exceeding level 2 on the Standard Scale.
  - (2) Any person who with intent to defraud interferes with the apparatus or device referred to in Article 6(2) of this Order or operates or attempts to operate it by the insertion of objects other than current coins of the appropriate denomination shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding level 3 on the Standard Scale.
