

The amount which a local authority borrows within its annual quota will bear interest at the appropriate rate in the quota set of rates. Authorities may borrow further sums at quota rates at the discretion of the Public Works Loan Commissioners. Other borrowing beyond the quota entitlement will be at the appropriate rate in the non-quota set of rates.

My Lords concur.

The Treasury determine the rates of interest accordingly.

## RATES OF INTEREST ON LOANS FROM THE NATIONAL LOANS FUND

### NOTICE

The Treasury in pursuance of section 5 of the National Loans Act 1968 (as amended) hereby give notice that on or after 13th November 1991:

### *Notice of Public Path Order*

#### TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1990

#### *The Wakefield Stanley Public Path No. 9 Temporary Diversion (No. 2) Order 1991*

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for the Environment in exercise of the powers conferred on him by sections 247, 253 and 261 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990, and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, proposes to make an Order, if planning permission is granted for development to be carried out, consisting of the extraction of opencast coal, to H. J. Banks & Co. Limited, by the Secretary of State for the Environment. The effect of the Order will be to divert for a period not exceeding 12 months Public Path No. 9 in the Metropolitan District of the City of Wakefield at Stanley starting from a point (a) 400 metres from its junction with Fenton Road and extending 360 metres in a south-easterly direction to a point marked 'F', then in a north-easterly direction for 100 metres to a point marked 'E'. The lines and situations of the existing and proposed alternative footpaths are shown on the map annexed to the Order.

The proposed Order will require the restoration of the diverted length of footpath at the end of the said period.

A copy of the Order and the map annexed to it has been deposited at the offices of the City of Wakefield Metropolitan District Council. Chantry House, 123 Kirkgate, Wakefield WF1 1YG, and may be inspected, free of charge, at the Council offices during normal working hours from 15th November 1991 to 13th December 1991.

Any representation or objection to the draft Order may be sent in writing to the Secretary of State for the Environment (ref. YH 5115/151/11) Yorkshire and Humberside Regional Office, City House, Leeds, not later than 13th December 1991, and should state the grounds on which it is made.
