DURHAM COUNTY COUNCIL

*The County of Durham Prohibition of Driving Order 1991**Unclassified Un-named Access Road from Road A688 Spennymoor Bypass to Oakdene Terrace, Middlestone Moor*

The Durham County Council propose to make an Order under sections 1(1) and (2), 2(1) to (3) and 3(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

The effect of the Order will be to prohibit the driving of any motor vehicle in the lengths of road at Middlestone Moor specified in the Schedule hereto.

The Order contains exemptions in respect of building operations or demolitions, maintenance of the road, fire brigade, police or ambulance vehicles and statutory powers.

Prohibition of Waiting Order 1991

The Durham County Council propose to make Orders under sections 1(1) and (2), 2(1) to (3) and 4(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the effect of which will be as set out in the Schedules to these notices.

The Orders contain exemptions in respect of boarding or alighting; loading or unloading of goods; building operations and demolitions; removal of obstruction to traffic; maintenance of the road, Post Office vehicles, fire brigade, police or ambulance vehicles; statutory powers and disabled persons.

On both sides of the un-named access road between No. 20 Victor Terrace and No. 25 South View, from its junction with road C17 northwards for a distance of 25 metres, and on the north side of road C17 for a distance of 5 metres east and west of its junction with the un-named access road.

On both sides of Cook Avenue from its junction with road C17 northwards for a distance of 6 metres, and on the north side of road C17 from its junction with Cook Avenue in a westerly direction for a distance of 5 metres, and in an easterly direction to a point 5 metres east of the western gable of the Co-op building.

On both sides of the un-named access road adjacent to the west gable of the Co-op building, from its junction with road C17 northwards for a distance of 3 metres.

The County of Dyfed (Class III Croeslan to Penrhiwllan Road) (Imposition of 40 m.p.h. Speed Limit) Order 1991
