

(3) The Local Planning Authority is under a duty to formulate and publish proposals for the preservation and enhancement of the Conservation Area, and to pay special attention to the desirability of preserving and enhancing the character or appearance of the Conservation Area.

(4) Planning applications for development which would, in the opinion of the Local Planning Authority affect the character or appearance of the Conservation Area must be given publicity and representations received in consequence taken into account in determining the application.

NEW TOWN ACT 1981

Compulsory Purchase of Land in Stony Stratford Milton Keynes

Notice is hereby given that the Milton Keynes Development Corporation on 18th November 1991, made the Milton Keynes Development Corporation Stony Stratford Compulsory Purchase Order 1991, No. 2 under section 10(1)(a) of the New Towns Act 1981. They have submitted this Order to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation, and if confirmed, the Order will authorise them to purchase compulsorily the land described in the Schedule below for the purpose of the development of the New Town of Milton Keynes.

A copy of the Order and of the accompanying map may be seen at all reasonable hours at Saxon Court, 502 Avebury Boulevard, Central Milton Keynes.

Any objection to the Order must be made in writing to the Secretary of State for the Environment, 2 Marsham Street, London SW1 2EB, before 23rd December 1991, and should state the title of the Order and the grounds of objection.

The Secretary of State is not required in every case to arrange for a public local inquiry to be held or for objections to be heard by a person appointed by him for that purpose. It is important, therefore, that any objection should include a full statement in writing of the grounds on which the objection is made, as the objector may have no further opportunity to make such a statement.

Any owner or occupier of any of the land to which the Order relates may (whether or not he makes an objection to the Order) send to Milton Keynes Development Corporation a request in writing that, in the event of the Order being confirmed by the Secretary of State, he be served with a notice stating that the Order has been confirmed and naming a place where a copy of the Order and of the map or maps and any descriptive matter annexed thereto may be seen. Any such request must state the name and postal address of the owner or occupier making it, must state the nature of his interest in the land and must include sufficient particulars to enable the extent and boundaries of his land to be identified.

Stopping-up of Highway: unclassified road leading to Ince Castle, Saltash
