- (e) provide that certain vehicles may wait in the parking places in certain circumstances, e.g., to allow persons to board or alight (maximum 2 minutes), to load or unload (maximum 20 minutes), etc.

A copy of the Order, which will come into operation for the purposes of placing the traffic signs on 9th December 1991, and for all other purposes on 16th December 1991, of the Council's statement of reasons for proposing to make the Order, of maps indicating the location and effect of the Order and of the Enfield (Free Parking Places) (Disabled Persons) (No. 1) Order 1983 (and of the Orders which have previously amended or applied that Order) can be inspected at the Reception Desk, "B" Block, the Civic Centre, Silver Street, Enfield, Middlesex EN1 3XD, during normal office hours on Mondays to Fridays inclusive until the end of 6 weeks from the date on which this Order was made.
