# **COAST PROTECTION ACT 1949**

## BARROW-IN-FURNESS BOROUGH COUNCIL

# **ROAD TRAFFIC ACTS**

#### BERKSHIRE ROYAL COUNTY COUNCIL

Royal County of Berkshire (Northbrook Street, Newbury) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) (Amendment) (Experimental) Order 1991.

Notice is hereby given that the County Council of the Royal County of Berkshire has made an Order under section 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984. The Borough of Newbury (Northbrook Street) (Restriction of Waiting) Order 1967 and Borough of Newbury (Northbrook Street—Various Junctions) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1967 contain no exemption to allow hackney carriages to park on authorised cab ranks on the roads affected by the Orders. The effect of the experimental Order will be to provide such an exemption in these Orders to allow hackney carriages to wait on that length of Northbrook Street, Newbury, from a point 5 metres south of its junction with Albert Road in a southerly direction for a distance of 25 metres.

The Order was made on 27th November 1991 and will come into operation on 6th December 1991 for a maximum period of 18 months.
