MID GLAMORGAN COUNTY COUNCIL

The Mid Glamorgan County Council (Unnamed Lane linking Penrhwi-ceiber Road and Station Terrace, Penrhwi-ceiber) (Prohibition of Driving) Order 1991.

Notice is hereby given that on 25th November 1991 the Mid Glamorgan County Council made an Order under sections 1 and 2 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the effect of which is to prohibit any person from causing any vehicle to proceed in that section of the unnamed lane linking Penrhwi-ceiber Road and Station Terrace, from its junction with Penrhwi-ceiber Road for a distance of 2 metres.

The Order came into operation on 28th November 1991 and a copy thereof and a map showing the roads and sides of the lengths of roads to which the Order relates may be inspected at the offices of the Mid Glamorgan County Council, Cathays Park, Cardiff, during normal office hours until the end of 6 weeks from 28th November 1991.

MID GLAMORGAN COUNTY COUNCIL

The Mid Glamorgan County Council (Caemawr Road, Porth) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1991

Notice is hereby given that the Mid Glamorgan County Council made an Order under sections 1, 2 and 4 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the effect of which will be to prohibit the waiting of vehicles at any time on the side of lengths of road specified in the Schedule to this notice.

Exemptions will be provided in the Order to enable Medical Practitioners and Veterinary Surgeons to visit while "on call" and for the purposes of boarding, alighting, loading and unloading, building and road works, the maintenance, improvement, reconstruction, inspection or survey of the side of lengths of road, the maintenance of essential services, weddings, funerals and the delivery or collection of postal packets by vehicles in the service of the Post Office. Disabled persons' vehicle displaying the relevant disabled person's badge will be allowed to wait for up to 2 hours with return prohibited within 1 hour.

A copy of the proposed Order, a statement of the Council's reasons for proposing to make the Order, and a map showing the side of lengths of road to which the proposed Order relates may be inspected at the offices of the Rhondda Borough Council, Llewellyn Street, Pentre and at the Mid Glamorgan County Hall, Cathays Park, Cardiff during normal office hours.

Objections to the proposal, together with the grounds on which they are made must be sent in writing to the undersigned by 23rd December 1991.

(i) The South-western side of Caemawr Road, Porth, from the eastern side of its junction with the access road leading to Tynycymmer House, south-eastwards or a distance of 15 metres (16 yards)
