

2. Existing prohibitions and restrictions will be incorporated.

The usual exemptions will be provided. Relevant documents may be inspected at my Office or at the Office of the Secretary and Solicitor, Nottingham City Council, The Guildhall, Nottingham. Any person wishing to question the validity of the Order (which was made on 15th November 1991) or any of the provisions contained in it on the grounds that they are not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or any Instrument made under it, has not been complied with in relation to the Order may, within 6 weeks from 15th November 1991, apply to the High Court for this purpose.

The Order is made as described in the Notice of Proposal (ref: 545) which appeared in Issue No. 52621 of the *London Gazette* dated 2nd August 1991.

The prohibition is intended to alleviate problems experienced by vehicles turning in and out of Lancaster Road due to parked vehicles.

The Order will come into force on 2nd December 1991.

ROCHDALE METROPOLITAN BOROUGH COUNCIL

*Metropolitan Borough of Rochdale (Rochdale Road, Middleton)
(Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1991*
