- (b) Anyone wishing to demolish a building or part of a building situated within the conservation area must first apply for consent to the Local Planning Authority.
- (c) Anyone wishing to cut down, lop or uproot a tree situated within the conservation area must give prior notice of his intention to the Local Planning Authority.
