

People to persist in their Revolt, are sent to be close confined in divers Prisons of Spain. Besides which, twenty eight Ecclesiasticks and Religious of several Orders, have been ordered to depart Barcelona in four and twenty hours, and Catalonia in 8 Days, with a Prohibition to enter any of the Dominions of the Spanish Monarchy. All the People of Catalonia are disarming. The Marshal Berwick has sent to Majorca M. d'Adoncourt, Adjutant-General of his Army, to confer with the Governor and the principal Persons of the Island.

Paris, Nov. 10. N. S. The Queen of Spain arrived at Antibes the 19th of last Month, and the 27th at Marfeilles, where she designed to stop three Days.

Ratisbon, Octob. 29. N. S. The Protestation of the Elector Palatine against the intire Restitution of the Elector of Bavaria, which is stipulated by the Treaty of Baden, relates not only to the upper Palatinate and the County of Cham, but to the Dignity of High Steward of the Empire, and his Rank in the Electoral College, till some Equivalent be given him. On the 25th Instant another Protestation of the same Tenour was made by the Prince Palatine of Sultzbach, as Heir to the Elector Palatine, in case his Electoral Highness and his Brothers dye without Male Issue. On the 26th a Protestation in the Name of the King of Great Britain, as Elector of Hahover, was entered in the Electoral College, against the Re-establishment of the Elector of Bavaria in his Rank and Dignity, as being Prejudicial to what his Majesty now enjoys as High-Treasurer of the Empire. On the 25th a Letter from the Magistrates of Liege was communicated to the Diet, complaining of the Jurisdiction which the Governor of the Citadel pretends to have a Right to Exercise, and desiring them to intercede with the Emperor, to the end the Garrison of the States-General may be removed without delay.

Antwerp, Nov. 6. N. S. Yesterday Mr. Cadogan, Plenipotentiary from the King of Great Britain, came hither from Brussels; and having notified his Arrival to the Deputies of the States General, they made him the first Visit this Morning, gave him a succinct Account of what has passed between the Emperor's Minister and them in the Negotiation of the Barrier, and intend to put into his Hands forthwith Copies of the Propositions that have been made on both Sides, as also the Remarks of each Party on the several Points proposed.

Hague, Nov. 13. N. S. On the 10th the Countess of Portland went from hence for England, as did the next Day Count Nostitz Envoy Extraordinary from the King of Poland, and yesterday Prince Kurakin Ambassador from the Czar. The Courier whom the Count de Koningseck dispatched to Vienna the 14th of last Month, returning to Antwerp the 7th Instant, a Conference was held the 9th in the Stadhouse there, at which Mr. Cadogan assisted. The States-General have received an Express from their Deputies at Antwerp, and two of those Deputies, viz. M. Van der Dussen and Count Rechteren are expected here to Morrow, to make Report to their High Mightinesses of their Negotiations about the Barrier. Yesterday Baron Heems, the Emperor's Minister here, had a Conference with the States. Their High Mightinesses have not yet nominated their Ambassadors to Congratulate the King of Great Britain on his Accession to the Throne. We have Advice, that the Ratifications of the Treaty of Peace concluded at Baden between the Emperor and Empire and France, were exchanged there the 28th of last Month.
