TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1990

Proposed Stopping-up of a Highway at Rusholme, Manchester

The Secretary of State for Transport hereby gives notice that on the application of Downs and Variava on behalf of Manchester University he proposes to make an Order under section 247 of the above Act to authorise the stopping-up of Kent Road East, Rusholme, Manchester, to enable development of a hall of residence for students to be carried out in accordance with planning permission granted to Manchester University (Estates Department).

HIGHWAYS ACT 1980

The Kent County Council (A257 Ash By-pass Classified Road) (Side Roads) Order 1990

The Secretary of State for Transport hereby gives notice that he has confirmed with modifications the above Order which was made by the Kent County Council under sections 14 and 125 of the Highways Act 1980 and which, as confirmed, authorises the Council:

- (1) to carry out the improvement of highways;
- (2) to stop up highways;
- (3) to construct new highways;
- (4) to stop up private means of access to premises; and
- (5) to provide new means of access to premises

all in relation to the classified road, being in part lengths of the A257 Canterbury to Sandwich Road and in part new highway to be constructed all between the Green Man public house, Sandwich Road, Shatterling and the A257 Sandwich Bypass in the District of Dover, in the County of Kent.

Any person aggrieved by the Order and desiring to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein, on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act 1980 or on the
