**T**HE following Address was presented to his Majesty by his Grace the Duke of Montrose, one of his Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State.

To the KING's most Excellent Majesty.

The humble Address of the Royal Burrows of Scotland.

**W**E your Majesty's most faithful Subjects have impatiently waited this Opportunity of being brought together in a full Convention, that we might jointly and with one Heart congratulate your Majesty's happy and peaceful Accession to the Throne of Great Britain, and reasonable Arrival therein.

When we reflect upon the Royal Bounty and Favour of the great and glorious King William and Queen Ann of ever blessed Memory to the State of Burrows, and the particular Marks of their Affection which they bestowed upon us, whereby their Majesties did fully evidence their confidence in our faithfulness to their Interests; and that the Crown is now so happily settled upon your Sacred Majesty by an unquestionable Rightful and Lawful Succession to your Royal Progenitors, we must adore and bless the Divine Goodness which has so conspicuously shined in all this great and remarkable Conjunction of Providence.

We have now the glorious prospect, that by your Majesty's Administration, our Religion, Laws and Liberties, and our Presbyterian Church Government, as by Law establish'd shall be invariably maintained, our Trade encouraged, and freed from the Embarrassments it lies under by destructive Treaties of Commerce; and that all the other Blessings which conduce to the Happiness of Mankind, shall flow upon us and our Fellow Subjects. So that we think our selves bound by the strictest Ties of Duty, to abide firm and loyal to your Majesty; and as we have Access in our Stations to intill the same Principles of Loyalty and Obedience in the several Incorporations which we represent:

It remains for us to offer up to the Almighty God our hearty Prayers for the great Deliverances he has wrought for us from our Fears and Apprehensions of Danger we were under, as well as with the utmost Sincerity pray, That it may please the Divine Goodness to pour down his best Blessings upon you Majesty and your Royal Progeny; and that after a long and happy Reign over us, the Crown of this Realm may descend to your Royal Posterity in a long and uninterrupted succession, and may continue to be the great Guardians of the Protestant Religion throughout all Europe.

May it please your Majesty, your Majesty's most loyal, most dutiful and obedient Subjects and Servants.

The Convention of the Royal Burrows met at Edinburgh the 9th of November 1714. Signed at our Appointment, and in our Presence by George Warrender of Lochead, Lord Provost of Edinburgh, our Prefes.

To which his Majesty was pleas'd to make the following most gracious Answer.

An humble Address of the Gentlemen, Freeholders, and Freeholders of the Lordship, Barony and Regality of Glasgow; presented to his Majesty by his Grace the Duke of Montrose, one of his Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State.

An humble Address of the Mayor, Bailiffs and Burgeses of the Corporation of Southampton; presented to his Majesty by the Right Honourable the Lord Carteret.

An humble Address of the Mayor, Burgeses and Commonalty of the Count Borough of Carmarthen; pre-

All which Addresses his Majesty was pleas'd to receive very graciously.

Madrid, Nov. 12. N.S. Two Days ago the Peace concluded between this Crown and the Saes General of the united Provinces of the Netherlands, was proclaimed here in the usual Places, and in the accustomed Form: But no Illuminations or other publick Demonstrations of Joy were ordered to be made, it being given out that the Ministry will regulate the Rejoicings here according to what shall be advised to have been practis'd on the same Occasion at the Hague. The to day came Advice of the Queen's having proceeded from Marseilles on her way hither. Her Aunt the Queen Dowager, has Permission to go from Bayonne to Pau the Capital of Bearn, so make her Majesty a Visit in her Passage, and 'tis reckoned her Majesty will arrive at Pampelona the 20th of this Month. The Duke of Berwick set off from hence for France the 4th in the Morning; the following Night a Cabinet-Courier arrived from Versailles, with Letters for Monsieur Orry to be communicated to that Duke; wherupon Monsieur Orry went away the next Morning with all Expedition to overtake him; and on the 6th returned with him hither. The Advices from Catalonia continue to relate that all is quiet there, they tell us likewise, that two Persons having been hanged at Manresa, for not delivering up their Arms, but concealing them in Disobedience to the Proclamation issued on that Subject, the People taking warning by their Example, had without farther Delay brought in all their Arms, to which they were besides induced by the Distribution of the French and Spanish Troops into Quarters all over the Country to keep turbulent Spirits in Awe. Prince Tserclaes de Tilly met at Barcelona the 28th of last Month, having been met at some distance without the Place by the principal Officers and Nobility: Workmen were employ'd in undermining the Fortifications of that City, which are to be blown up and razed, and a Citadel is to be built with the Materials. The Hopes we had of the immediate Submission of Majorca are vanished; Don Pedro de los Rios, who with 6 Ships and some Land-forces was sent to Summon that Island and take Possession of it; being returned to Barcelona with Answer from the Governor, that he cannot give up his Trust without an Order from the Court of Vienna: Some Advices add, that the Majorcans having applied to the Governor of Port-Mahon for Assistance, were refused, at least 'till the Pleasure of the Court of Great-Britain thereupon be known. The Marquis de Mulazzani, Envoy Extraordinary from the Duke of Parma, having made his Master's Compliments to the King on his Marriage, is set out on his return Home. Mr. Burch, his Britannick Majesty's Secretary here, had an Audience of his Catholick Majesty the 10th, being introduced by the Marquis de Grimaldo Secretary of State; and delivered a Letter from the King of Great Britain notifying his Accession to the Throne.
