

Claims may be made twelve months after the date of first use that is on or after 29th March 1992 (the "first claim day"). Claims should be made within six years from this date. However, any person who within the twelve months preceding that date makes a contract for disposing of his interest or (insofar as the interest is in land which is not a dwelling) for granting a tenancy may make a claim within that period and must do so before the interest is disposed of or the tenancy granted. Compensation in such cases will not be payable before the beginning of the claim period.
