TENDERS FOR STERLING TREASURY BILLS

1. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Securities Office, Bank of England, Threadneedle Street, on Friday, 24th January 1992 at 1 p.m. for Sterling Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act 1877 and the National Loans Act 1968, to the amount of £300,000,000 for Bills due 91 days after date and £100,000,000 for Bills due 182 days after date.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000, £100,000, £250,000, £500,000, £1,000,000, £5,000,000 or £10,000,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, 27th January 1992 to Friday, 31st January 1992, inclusive.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated and the net amount per cent. (being a multiple of half of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates and different tenors.

5. Notification will be sent on the day of the Tender to the persons whose Tenders are accepted in whole or in part.

6. If delivery of Treasury Bills into the Central Moneymarkets Office has been requested, payments will be effected through that system; otherwise payment in full of the amount due in respect of an accepted Tender must be made to the Bank of England, not later than 1.30 p.m. on the day on which the relevant Bills are to be dated and on which they are to be collected from the Securities Office, by one of the following means: (a) cash, (b) banker's draft payable through the Town Clearing, (c) cheque drawn on the Bank of England, (d) CHAPS payment (subject to evidence of payment). Bills will only be released by the Bank of England when evidence of payment has been received).

7. Tenders should be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from Securities Office, Bank of England. Particular forms are available for Bills of each maturity but where special, prior arrangements have been made with the Bank of England, tenders may be accepted by other means.

The Monmouth-Fishguard Trunk Road (A40) (Carmarthen Eastern By-Pass) Order 199

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for Wales hereby gives notice that he proposes to make an Order under sections 10, 12, 106 and 108 of the Highways Act 1980, which will:

- (a) provide that roads which he proposes to construct along the following routes shall become trunk roads as from the date when the Order comes into force:
 - (i) a route (the main route) about 5.89 kilometres (3.66 miles) in length at Carmarthen in the county of Dyfed between the Pensarn Roundabout and a point on the A40 Trunk Road about 50 metres east of White Mill side road;
 - (ii) routes for slip roads to connect the main route with existing roads at Tanerdy, Carmarthen, and
- (b) authorise him to construct as part of the route on the main route a bridge over the navigable waters of the River Towy and to divert that river in the vicinity of that bridge; and
- (c) provide that a length of the Monmouth-Fishguard Trunk Road (A40) to be superseded by the new trunk road on the main route mentioned above, shall cease to be a trunk road and shall be classified as a classified road as from the date on which the Secretary of State notifies the County Council of Dyfed (who will become the highway authority responsible for that length) that the said new trunk road is open for through traffic.
