

The County of Humberside (Cleethorpes Borough) (Pelham Road, Immingham) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting and Loading) Order 1988.

(f) Revoke Schedule 3 of the following Order:

The County of Humberside (Cleethorpes Borough) (Various Streets, Immingham) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) Order 1981.

Exemptions will include permission to wait for the purposes of picking up and setting down passengers, loading and unloading, the maintenance of roads, gas, water and electricity supplies, and for police, ambulance and fire brigade purposes.

KINGSTON-UPON-HULL CITY COUNCIL

The County of Humberside (Kingston-upon-Hull) (Inglemire Lane and Cranbrook Avenue) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) Order 1991.

Notice is hereby given that the Kingston-upon-Hull City Council on 22nd January 1991, made the above Order under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984. The Order will come into operation on 27th January 1992.

LEICESTER CITY COUNCIL

The Leicester (Experimental) Traffic Regulation (Green Lane Road) Order 1992

Notice is hereby given that Leicester City Council, as agents authorised by Leicestershire County Council, have made the following Order under section 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, to come into operation on 10th February 1992.

The effect of this Order will be on an experimental basis to:

1. Prohibit vehicles waiting at any time, except for permitted loading for a period of 20 minutes between 9.30 a.m. to 4 p.m. and 6 p.m. to 7.30 a.m., Monday to Friday, in Green Lane Road, the north-east side, between its junction with Bridge Road and a point 48 metres west thereof (excluding the layby).
2. Prohibit vehicles waiting between 9.30 a.m. to 4 p.m., Monday to Saturday, except for limited waiting for a period of 60 minutes, in Green Lane Road, the north-east side, the layby situated between its junctions with Bridge Road and Stroud Road.

The Council will consider in due course whether the provisions of this Order shall be continued in force indefinitely.

Any person may object in writing to the making of an Order for the purposes of such indefinite continuation within a period of six months from 10th February 1992.

LEICESTERSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL

Leicestershire County Council (Coventry Road (A427) Lutterworth) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 199

The Barnet (Loading Places) (No.) Order 199
