Turin Novemb. 17. N. S. The Proteslants of the Valleys having deputed M. Bastie, Appia, and Bres, to com-pliment the King of Sicily on his Accession to the Crown, and on his fafe Return to his antient Dominions, those Deputies were admitted to an Audience of his Majesty Yesterday Morning at Moncalier: His Ma-jesty received them very gractously, and assured the Protestant Vaudois of his Royal Protection. Some Day before, several Protestants who during his Majesty's Ab-fence had been banished from the Valleys to different Places in Plemont, had his Leave fent them to return home.

Mad id, Novemb. 19, N S. A Proclamation has been affixed publickly in the utual Places here, by which all H sekeepers are commanded to appear before the 'Al caldes of their respective Quarters, and inform their what Persons lodge in their Houses, their Names, and their Profession or Business: The like Order has been fign fied to the Heads of the several Convens. Here i. great Talk of a new Plan for administring the Government, which has been some Days under Deliberation, and will be put in Execution very speecily; and as the lessening the Councils is reported to be one Branch of this Scheme, all the Ministers who are Members of them are in no little Anxiety. 'Tis said there are to be five Secretaries of State; and that the Bishop of Gironda is already nominated for Ecclesiastical Affairs, D n Joseph Grimaldo for all Transactions with Foreign Ministers or Courts, Don Manuel Vadillo for the Finances, Dor Miguel Duran for War, and Don Bernardo Tinagero fop the Navy and for Commerce. Tis also said, that a military Governour, and a Court of Justice composed of Persons of the long Robe, will be established in each of the 21 Provinces. Tis advised from Barcelona, that the 9th Inflant an Order was published, commanding all Cassilians, Arragonians, and Valencians, who sided with the Enemy and retired into Catalonia, to depart all the Dominions of Spain: Which Sentence falls very unexpectedly on many Persons, who flattered themselves Esqrs, and Sir Charles Piers, Kt. to be Commissioners to that fince the Reduction of that Province they might the Receipt and Management of his Majesty's Customs. have remarked quietly to their former Habitations.

Paris, Dec. 5. N. S. The Dike of Oileans has had an Apoplectick Fit, but is preity well recovered. The Quoen of Spain continues her Jeurney towards Pampelona, where great Preparations are made for her Reception and where 'tis reckoned the will arrive the 8th of this Month. The Princels Urlini is to come as far as Xadraque to meet her Majesty, and the King will receive fer at Guadalixara.

Hague, December 4 N. S. M. Palmquist, Envoy of Sweden, has notified to the States-General, and to most or the Foreign M nisters residing here, the safe Return of the King his Master to his Dominions his Majesty arriving (after 15 Days riding Post) at Stralfund on the 22d of last Month. M. Pettegum Minister of Holstein, has lately presented a Memorial to the States General, demanding the Pertormance of their High Mightineffes Guarantie of the Treaty of Travendale: That Minister is gone to Amsterdam for a tew Days, and soon after is return hither will ser out for England, whither ount Effects Minister of the Elector Palatine, will likew se be going very speedily. The Earl of Albemarle designs to ser our in tew Days for Tournay, of which e is Gover: or and from theree to proceed directly to ngland by the way of Oftend. The Marquis de Cha-eauneut the French Ambassador, has lately presented a Memorial to the States-General, in Favour of the House of Charlons with respect to the Succession of Orange, o fome Part of which Succession that Family p etend o have a Right: M. Meindershagen, the King of Prus-sia's Minister here, has likewise had lately several Conferences on the same Subject, in order to vindicate the Right of the King his Mafter in relation to that Succeffion; this Munfier has delivered to their High Mightinesses the King his Master's Ratification of a Convencion lately made between his Prussian Majesty and this State, for the mu ual Passage of Troops through each other's Territories. The Mary Yacht is afrived at Roterdam, in order to carry over the Earl of Strafford to England. M. Dorp has been presented, on the Part of the Nobility of Holland to the States General, as one f the Persons to be nominated Ambassadors to the King of Great Britain; and M. Burmania has been presented on the Part of the Province of Friseland, for another of those Ambassadors; tis expected that a third will be fixed, and this Matter finally determined the 6th Instant, when the States of Holland are to resssemble. States of Utrecht having passed a Resolution for disbanding two Companies of the Swift Troops which are paid by that Province, the Regents of the Canton of Berne have written a Latier to the Scates General upon ir, allidging the Treaty be ween this Republick and them, by which this State has obliged it felf to keep in Pay 24 Companies of those Troops, as well in time of Peace as of War. Their High Mightinesses have couled several Representations to be made to the Province of Utrecht, but hitherto without effect the States of the Province pleading their Inability to maintain those Troops any
