Proposed Stopping-up of Areas of Footway in Sawclose and Monmouth Street, Bath

Importation of Animal Products and Poultry Products Order 1980 (As Amended)

Notice is hereby given that as provided by Article 4 of the Importation of Animal Products and Poultry Products Order 1980 (as amended) the Ministry of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food and Welsh Office, Agriculture Department have, with effect from 13th January 1992, issued the following licences with conditions, as detailed below:

Conditions attaching to the licence

Each consignment must be accompanied by a certificate issued in accordance with the terms of the Council Directive on health problems affecting trade in poultry meat, 71/118/EEC (as amended) annotated in accordance with the terms of Council Directive 88/657/EEC on trade in minced meat, meat in pieces of less than 100 grams and meat preparations, signed by an official veterinarian of the country of origin certifying:

1. Details of consignment ie species, packaging, weight;

2. Address(es) and veterinary approval number(s) of approved establishments.

- 3. Destination of meat, means of transport including registration/flight no;
- Health attestation:

(a) the poultry meat preparations described above bear a mark proving that the meat comes from animals slaughtered in approved slaughterhouses;

(b) the poultry meat preparations have been passed fit for human consumption following a veterinary inspection carried out in accordance with the Council Directive of 15th February 1971, on health problems affecting trade in fresh poultry meat;

(c) the transport vehicles or containers and the loading conditions of this consignment meet the hygiene requirements

laid down in the Directive.

(d) the undersigned, official veterinarian, hereby certifies that the poultrymeat preparations described above were obtained under the conditions of production and inspection laid down in Directive 88/657/EEC laying down the requirements for the production of, and trade in meat preparations and amending Directives 64/433/EEC, 71/118/EEC and 72/462/EEC.

Notes attaching to the licence

1. The licence will not be invalidated by transit of goods through other countries provided they are transported in a sealed container and provided that if the goods are examined by Customs en-route the container is resealed and the documents are endorsed accordingly.

2. Nothing in this licence gives exemption from any prohibiting or restriction imposed by the Imported Food Regulations 1984, or the Medicines Acts 1968, and 1971, or by any regulation superseding or amending the same, or any prohibition, regulation or restriction imposed by the Secretary of State for Trade and Industry.

3. This is not a Department of Trade and Industry Licence.
