OST Reverend, and Right Reverend Fathers in God, We greet you well: Whereas we are given to understand, That there have of late been great Differences among fome of the Clergy of this Our Realm, about their ways of Expressing themselves in their Sermons and Writings concerning the Doctrine of the Bleffed Trinity: And whereas also unufual Liberties have been taken by feveral of the faid Clergy, in intermeddling with the Affairs of State and Govern-ment, and the Conflictution of the Realm, Both which may be of very dangerous Confequence, if not timely prevented: We therefore, out of our Princely Care and Zeal for the Prefervation of the Peace and Unity of the Church, together with the Purity of the Christian Faith, and alfo for Preierving the Peace and Quiet of the State, Have thought fit to fend you these following Directions, which we straitly Charge and Command you to Publish, and to fee that they be observed within your several Dioceses.

HAT no Preacher whatfoever, in his Sermon or Lecture, do presume to deliver any other Dostrine concorning the Bleffed Irmity, than what is contained in the Holy Scripsures. and is agreeable to the Three Creeds, and the

Thirsy nine Articles of Religion. 11. That in the Explication of this Dottrine they carefully avoid all new Terms, and confine themfelves to fuch ways of

Expression as have been commonly used in the Church. 111. That Care be taken in this Matter, especially to ob-ferve the Fifty third Canon of this Church, which forbids publick Opposition between Preachers; because (as that Canon Lxpreffes it) there groweth thereby much Offence and Difquietmels unto the People : And that above all things they abstain from bitter Invectives and Scurrilous Language against all Berfons whatfoever.

1V. That none of the Clergy in their Sermons or Lestures, prefume to intermeddle in any Affairs of State or Government, or the Constitution of the Realm, fave only on such Special For the Confination of the Realm, face only on face Special Feafly and Fafts as are or shall be appointed by Publick Autho-rity; and then, no further than the Occasion of fuch Days shall firitly require. Provided always, That nothing in this Direction shall be understood to discharge any Person from Preaching in Defence of Our Regal Supremacy Established by Law, as often, and in such manner as the First Canon of this church disk termine Church doth require,

V. That the foregoing Directions be also Observed by those who Write any thing concerning the faid Subjects. VI. Whereas also We are Credibly Inform d That it is the

Manner of f me in every Diocefe, before sheir Sermon. either to use a C llett and the Lord's Prayer, or the Lord's Prayer only, (which the Fifty fifth Canon prefcribes as the Conclu-fion of the Prayer, and not the whole Prayer) or at least to leave out Our Titles, by the faid Canon required to be Declared and Recognized: We do further Direct, That you Require your Glengy, in their Prayer before Sermon, That they do keep strictly to the Form in the faid Canon contained, or to the full Effect thereof.

VII. And whereas We also understand, That divers Perfons who are not of the Clergy, have of late prefumed not only to Talk and to Difpute against the Christian Faith, concerning the Destrine of the Bleffed Irinity, but also to Write and Pub-ligh Books and Pamphiets against the same, and 1 dustriously Spread them through the Kingdom, contrary to the known Laws in that, behalf made and macted ; and particularly to one Alt of Rarliament made in the Ninth-YAS' of King William the Third, Intituled, An AC for the more Effectual Suppreffing of Blafphemy and Prophaneness: We taking all the Matters above mentioned into Our Royal and Serious Confideration, and being definous to do what in Advances made on the Part of the Emperor to their High

DIRECTIONS to Our Archbifhops, and Bifhops, for the us lies, to put a Stop to these Diforders; do firitily Charge Preferving of Unity in the Church, and the Purity of the Christian Fauth, concerning the Holy Trinity; and also for Preferving the Peace and Quict of the State. and Command you, together with all other Means juitable to your holy Profession, to make use of your Authority actording to Law, for the Repression and Restraining of all such Expo-bitant Practices. And for your Assistance, We will give Charge to Our Judges, and all other Our Civil Officers, to do their Duty herein, in executing the faid Act, and all other Lawa against all such Persons as shall, by these meant, give Occasion of Scandal, Discord, and Disturbance in our Church and Kingdom Church and Kingdom.
