The Trunk Road (A5) (Chirk By-pass, Clwyd and Shropshire) (Prohibition of Pedestrians) Order 1992

Notice is hereby given that on 23rd March 1992, the Secretary of State made the above Order which will come into operation on 27th March 1992.

NEW TOWNS ACT 1981

The New Town of Milton Keynes Extinguishment of Public Rights of Way Bridleways Phase II.

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for the Environment, in exercise of his powers under section 23 of the New Towns Act 1981, has made an Order extinguishing, as from the date of the Order, the public rights of way over the following routes shown as a thick red line on the map referred to herein:

In the Parish of Bradwell Abbey, that part of bridleway No. 1 which is located between points 'A' and 'B' on the map, and which runs from the bridleway's junction with Alston Drive (50 metres south of the Stacey Bushes roundabout) in a southwesterly direction for a distance of approximately 240 metres.

That part of bridleway No. 4 in the parish of Bradwell Abbey which is located between points 'C', 'D', 'F' and 'G1' on the map, and which runs from the bridleway's junction with the Pub Pavilion service road at Brookside, Hodge Lea, in a southwesterly direction for a distance of approximately 200 metres, and then in a westerly direction, parallel to the northern carriageway of the A5 trunk road, for a distance of approximately 550 metres to the Hodge Lea Kiln Farm footbridge over the A5 (point 'D') and then in a generally southerly direction over the said footbridge to point 'F' and then in a generally westerly direction parallel to the southern carriageway of the A5 for a distance of approximately 450 metres to point 'G1' being the centre line of City Road H2 (Millers Way).

That part of bridleway No. 79 which is located between points 'G' and 'G1' on the map, and which runs from the southern end of the A5 Fullers Slade Greenley's footbridge in a generally easterly direction, parallel to the southern carriageway of the A5, for a distance of approximately 400 metres to the centre line

of City Road H2 (Millers Way).

At Wolverton, that part of bridleway No. 87 which is located between points 'H' and 'J' on the map, and which runs from the bridleway's junction with City Road H2 (Miller's Way) in a
