An humble Addrefs from the Prefident, the Members of the Council, and the Reprefentatives of the People met together in the General Affembly of the Ifland of Bar badocs; an humb'e Address from the Clergy of the Island o' Barbadoes; an humble Address from the Istorney and Sollicitor General, Barriflers and Practitioners in the Laws of the Island of Barbadocs; and also an humble Address from the Merchants and Traders of the tait Ifland; prefented to his Majefty by James Camb II, E q; Agent for the Government of Barbadoes, introduced by the Right Honourable the Lord Viscount Townshend, one of his Majefty's Principal Secretaries of State.

Which Addreffes bis Majefty was pleafed to receive very graciously.

Smirna, October 30. The 14th of this Month arrived Sig. Bonaventura Minelli, who is ap pointed to relide here as Conful from the Republick of Venice: But being juftly apprel@nfive that there will foon be a Rupture between the Turks and the Venetians, he judge dit behoved him to use the best Precautions he could, for preventing his being feized and impriloned as a Minister of his Republick when the War shall setually break out: He therefore waited privately on the other Foreign Confuls here, and defired them not to own or treat him as a Conful: And then he notified to the Cady, and other chief Magifirates of this City, on the 15th, that being come hither, not in the Quality of Conful, but to transact Affairs relating to the Confulate only as an Agent till the Senate fhould dispose of that Employment, he could not take on him a Puu lick Character, nor confequently offer to make Vifits of Ceremony. The Cady and the other principal Officers in the Government of this Place made Anfwer, that it was indifferent to them in what manner he fhould act, provided he would take Care to make them fuch Pretents as they held themfelves intituled to by Cultom from the Venetian Confulate: And to flop their Mouths, he has thought it fafeft for him to comply with that Cultom. The last Letters from Constanti nople, which are of the 20th Instant confirm that great Preparations for War by Sea and Land

ST. James's, December 27. The following Addressel are making there; and that it was not in the least doubted the Port will attempt next Spring the Reduction of the Morea (of which the prefent Grand Vizier is a Native) tho'a Rumour is likewife spread, that the Delign is against the flings of Sicily. The Navai Forces of Algiers, Junis and Tripoli are expected to join the Ottoman bleet, being obliged always to attend these Expeditions in time of War. These Letters add, that Veffels were continually imployed in transporting Janifaries and others in the Military S rvice, with Stores of Ammunition, to the Islands of Negropont and Candia, and the Parts adjacent. The toth of this N. 'nth, being the first Day of the Turkish Festival called Bairam, the Janifaries appeared, at the Seraglio, to receive the Sultan's Bounty, which is utually beflowed upon them on Occation of that Fealt: It being also the Cuftom at that time to diffribute among them Rice ready dreffed, they refufed to touch it, cry-ing out that it was mully and not fit to be eaten: The Grand Vilier dreading the Confequences of the mutinous Disposition he faw them in, fent for the chief Officer of the Grand Signior's Kitchen called Affi I a Ti, and after having caufed a hundred Blows to be given him on the Soles of his Feet, he condemned him to ferve at the Oar in the Gallies; he likewife fent for the Steward of the Kitchen, Mamet Aga, and committed him to Prifon; which Proceeding appealed the Janifaries.

Vienna, Dec. 10. N. S. The 4th Inftant M. Muller, Chancellor of Sweden, arrived here; and being admitted to an Audience of the Enperor, he rerurned Thank- in his Mafter's Name for all the Orders which his Imperial M j fly had been pleafed to give for that King's Reception, in cafe he had made his Journey publickly thro' the Auftrian Domin 0 is, and for the great Conveniency with which the Swedish Troops are furnished in their Pallage homewards. Baron Malknecht, Minister of the Elector of a Bavaria, will shortly fet out from Munich for Gratz, to fetch from thence the Princes Sons of that Elector; who 'tis believed will pass this ' way, to thank the Emperor for the Care which he has caufed to be taken of them during their Confinement

An irew's Day, the Emperor, attended by all the Knights of the Order of the Golden Fleece that are here, well mounted and magnificently dreffed in the ancient Habit of that Order, went in Cavalcade to the Cathedral Church, and after Divine Service returned to the Palace in the fame manner.
