PUBLIC SCHOOLS ACT 1868

The Governing Body of Westminster School have made a Statute in the terms appended hereto, the same is hereby published in the London Gazette as required by the above-named Act.

Any persons or body corporate authorised by the said Act may within two months after the publication hereof petition Her Majesty in Council to withhold Her approval from the whole or any part of the said Statute.

Statute made by the Governing Body of Westminster School on 12th February 1992.

We, the Governing Body of St. Peter's College, Westminster, commonly called Westminster School, in virtue of the powers invested in us by the Public Schools Act 1868 and of all other powers enabling us in that behalf do hereby make the following Statue amending the Statute sealed with our Common Seal the 28th July 1871 as subsequently amended.

STATUTE

1. This Statute shall take effect from and after the approval thereof by Her Majesty in Council.

The following Chapter shall be inserted between Chapters VI and VII of the Statute sealed with our corporate seal the 28th July 1871 and approved by the Queen in Council on 3rd November 1871 (as subsequently amended):

CHAPTER VIA

Scholarship and Bursary Funds

The Governing Body may apply income derived from the property of the School and income derived from trusts established or comprising gifts made for the general benefit of the School in augmenting the capital endowment or income of the Westminster

School Scholarship and Bursary Fund, or of any other charitable trust established to provided scholarships and bursaries at the School or at any subordinate or other school established in connection therewith.

Given under the Common Seal of the Governing Body of Westminster School this 12th day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and ninety two.
