

High Mightinesses Ambassador to the King of Great Britain, waits only for a Yacht from England to carry him over. The 15th the States of Hollaad and West-friseland re-assembled, to finish the several Matters which were before them, and in particular to dispose of the vacant military Employments which are in their Nomination; but they separated the 19th for a Fortnight, without coming to a Resolution on whom to confer those Employments. The States General, after frequent Conferences With Mr. Cadogan about the Barrier, dispatched a Courier on the 15th with new Instructions to their Deputies at Antwerp: The 17th Mr. Cadogan was again in Conference with their High Mightinesses on the same Subject, and the 18th that Minister set out for Antwerp, in order to assist at the Conferences to be renew'd there for adjusting that Treaty, upon which Couriers have been dispatched to the Imperial and British Courts. The 17th Count Wels, the Imperial Minister, who came lately from Liege, set out for Aix la Chapelle, where he is to execute a Commission in the Emperor's Name, and then proceed to Vienna. The States General having sent Orders to their Governors of the Towns of Luxembourg and Limbourg, to evacuate those Places to the Imperial Troops, we have Advice, that on the 16th Instant those Troops were admitted accordingly. The State of War for the ensuing Year has been sent to the several Provinces for their Approbation, and 'tis thought the States of this Province will give their Consent to it at their next Meeting. Yesterday in the Evening Mr. Horatio Walpole, Secretary to the Lord Viscount Townshend, arrived here from England, having dispatched from the Briel an Express to Mr. Cadogan, who is thereupon expected back here shortly from Antwerp.

St. James's, Jan, 17. Sir Roger Mostyn having been appointed Custos Rotulorum of the County of Flint, has also had the Honour to kiss his Royal Highness the Prince of Wales's Hand for the Constableness of Flint Castle.
