DORSET COUNTY COUNCIL

The County of Dorset (C33, West Stafford) (Weight Restriction) Order 199

Notice is hereby given that the Dorset County Council propose to make an Order under sections 1(1) and (2), 2(4) and 3(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

The effect of the Order will be to prohibit use by heavy commercial vehicles (over 7.5 tonnes gross weight) and coaches, on the length of the Dorchester to Crossways Road, from its junction with the West Stafford by-pass (south of Frome Farm and the railway bridge) through West Stafford village to its junction with Highgate Lane at Tenantrees.

Exemptions will permit vehicles to proceed on the length of road referred to for the purpose of picking-up or setting down passengers, loading or unloading goods, post office vehicles, vehicles in connection with any building or demolition operation, the maintenance of the road, the collection of household refuse, the supply of gas, water or electricity, work to any telegraphic line, agricultural purposes, and vehicles with a need to be garaged, serviced or repaired at any premises situated on or adjacent to that length of road referred to in the Order.

Full details of this proposal are contained in the Draft Order which together with a plan showing the length of road affected and a statement of the Council's reasons for proposing the make the Order, may be inspected Monday to Friday, during normal office hours at the Transportation and Engineering Department, Dorset County Council, County Hall, Dorchester and Planning and Environmental Services Department, West Dorset District Council, 58-60 High West Street, Dorchester.
