BIRMINGHAM CITY COUNCIL

*Birmingham City Council (Jewellery Quarter, Birmingham)
(Controlled Zone) Order 1992*

Notice is hereby given that on 26th June 1992, the above-named Council made the above-named Order under sections 1(1) and (2), 2(1) to (3), 3(2), 4(2), 32(1), 35(1), 45, 46, 49, 53, 101, 102 and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the Act"), and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act the effect of which, is as follows:

1. To introduce "pay and display" parking meters in certain lengths of the following streets:

Augusta Street, Frederick Street, Hockley Street, Northampton Street, Pitsford Street, Vyse Street and Warstone Lane.

The proposed charges for parking in these lengths of highway are:

30 new pence (30p) for a maximum of one hour parking;

60 new pence (60p) for a maximum of two hours parking;

90 new pence (90p) for a maximum of three hours parking; and

One pound twenty new pence (£1.20) for a maximum of four hours parking.

2. To revise the areas of parking places without payment in certain lengths of the following streets:

Albion Street, Branston Street, Camden Street, Caroline Street, Carver Street, Graham Street, Hall Street, Hockley Street, Hylton Street, Icknield Street, James Street, Kenyon Street, Key Hill, Key Hill Drive, Legge Lane, Mary Street, Moreton Street, Newhall Hill, Northwood Street Parade, Pemberton Street, Pitsford Street, Pope Street, Powell Street, Regent Place, Regent Street, Spencer Street, Sloane Street, Summer Hill Terrace, Tenby Street, Tenby Street North, Vittoria Street, Vyse Street, Warstone Lane and Warstone Parade East.

3. To introduce "no waiting at any time" in certain lengths of the following streets:

Albion Street, Arthur Place, Augusta Street, Branston Street, Camden Drive, Camden Street, Caroline Street, Carver Street, Frederick Street, Graham Street, Hall Street, Hockley Street, Hylton Street, Icknield Street, James Street, Kenyon Street, Key Hill, Key Hill Drive, Legge Lane, Mary Street, Moreton Street, Newhall Hill, Northampton Street, Northwood Street Parade, Pemberton Street, Pitsford Street, Pope Street, Powell Street, Regent Parade, Regent Place, Regent Street, Spencer Street, Sloane Street, Summer Hill Terrace, Tenby Street, Tenby Street North, Vittoria Street, Vyse Street, Warstone Lane and Warstone Parade East.

4. To introduce "one way traffic operation" in certain streets within the Jewellery Quarter (mostly as per the existing Traffic Regulation Order).

5. To introduce a compulsory left turn for all traffic proceeding in Vyse Street, upon reaching its junction with Hockley Hill/Great Hampton Street.

6. To vary or revoke existing traffic regulation Orders insofar as they conflict with the provisions of this Order.
