(A245), West Byfleet) (Prohibition of Right-turn) Order 1992*

*Borough Council of Woking (Various Roads in Knaphill)
(Weight Restriction) Order 1992*

Notice is hereby given that on 29th June 1992, Woking Borough Council made an Order on behalf of the County Council of Surrey pursuant to arrangements entered into under section 101 of the Local Government Act 1972 and in exercise of the powers contained in the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

The effect of the Order is to make permanent the scheme that has been operating since April 1991 whereby heavy goods vehicles with a plated weight exceeding 7.5 tonnes are prohibited from High Street, Broadway, Englefield Road, Queens Road, Highclere Court, Highclere Gardens, Highclere Road, Sussex Close and Sussex Road, Knaphill except for loading or upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform.

The alternative route for prohibited vehicles approaching from the west is via Bagshot Road (A322), Brookwood Lye Road, Hermitage Road, Amstel Way and Lockfield Drive and vice versa for vehicles approaching from the east.

A copy of the Order, together with a map showing the roads concerned, may be examined at the main reception area, Civic Offices, Gloucester Square, Woking, on weekdays during normal office hours. The Order will come into operation on 2nd July 1992.

HEREFORD AND WORCESTER COUNTY COUNCIL

The County of Hereford and Worcester (Infirmary Walk, Worcester) (Parking Places for Disabled Persons Vehicles) Order 1992

Notice is hereby given that Hereford and Worcester County Council propose to make an Order under sections 32(1) and 35(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 and of all other enabling powers the effect of which will be to restrict the parking of vehicles in that side of length of Infirmary Walk in the City of Worcester in the County of Hereford and Worcester specified in the Schedule to this notice to those carrying disabled persons and displaying a badge issued under the Local Authority's Orange Badge Scheme.

Any person parking in the side of length of road specified above shall not unreasonably prevent access to any premises adjoining the side of length of road or the use of the side of length of road by other persons, or so as to be a nuisance.

The County Council reserves the right to suspend parking in these streets to enable any street procession to take place or prevent obstruction or for any other appropriate reason.

Waiting by vehicles of the undermentioned classes or for the undermentioned purposes are exempted from the provisions of the Order:

- (a) to enable postal packets to be delivered and collected by Post Office vehicles;
- (b) to enable certain essential works to be carried out or in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
- (c) for fire brigade, ambulance and police purposes;
- (d) any building or demolition operation, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance of the roads and the supply and maintenance of any gas, electricity, water and telecommunications apparatus.

Full details of these proposals are contained in the draft Order which together with a map showing the side of length of road affected and a statement of the Council's reasons for proposing to make the Order, may be examined from Monday to Friday during normal office hours at:
