Provide exceptions which will permit waiting for the purposes of (a) the picking up and setting down of passengers; (b) goods to be loaded onto and unloaded from the vehicle; and a number of necessary purposes.

 Prohibit vehicles from making a right turn from the East Howdon Bypass (A187) to the unnamed access road to East Howdon situated 370 metres north of the roundabout at the junction of Northumberland Dock and Tyne View Terrace.
