## PARLIAMENTARY NOTICES

### RIVER USK BARRAGE (H.L.) (ADDITIONAL PROVISION)

Notice is hereby given that application has been made to Parliament in the present Session by Newport Borough Council ("the Borough Council") and Gwent County Council by Petition for Additional Provision for leave to introduce two clauses and a Schedule into the Bill now pending in Parliament under the above name or short title.

And notice is further given that a map referred to in the Additional Provision marked "Protected Property Areas Map" has been deposited for public inspection with the Director of Development, Newport Borough Council at Civic Centre, Newport NP9 4UR, with the Chief Executive Officer, Gwent County Council, at County Hall, Cwmbran NP44 2XH, with the Chief Executive, Monmouth Borough Council at Mamhilad House, Mamhilad Park Estate, Pontypool NP4 0YL and with the Town Clerk and Chief Executive, Torfaen Borough Council at Civic Centre, Pontypool NP4 6YB.

A copy of the Bill and of the Additional Provision may be inspected and copies obtained at the price of £2 for the Bill and 50p for the Additional Provision at each of the above-mentioned offices and at the offices of the undermentioned Parliamentary Agents.

Objection to the Additional Provision may be made by depositing a Petition against it. The Bill originated in the House of Lords and Petitions to that House against the Additional Provision may be presented by being deposited in the Office of the Clerk of the Parliaments in that House at any time before the Bill is considered by a Committee of that House, which will not be before 26th October 1992, or during the progress of the Bill before that Committee. Objection to the Bill with the Additional Provision included therein may also be made by depositing a Petition against the Bill in the House of Commons. The latest date for depositing a Petition against the Bill in the House of Commons is the tenth day after that on which the Bill receives its first reading in that House. If this day is a Sunday, Christmas Day or a Bank Holiday, or a day on which the House does not sit, the final date for depositing may be postponed.

## ROAD TRAFFIC ACTS

### AVON COUNTY COUNCIL

#### *Traffic Orders, District of Wansdyke*

Notice is hereby given that the County Council of Avon proposes to make the following Orders under provisions contained in the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended:

1. The County Council of Avon (Various Roads, Corston, Keynsham and Saltford Area, District of Wansdyke) (Prohibition of Heavy Commercial Vehicles of over 7.5 Tonnes Maximum Gross Weight) Order 199 under sections 1(1) and (2), 2(4) and 3(2) and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the effect of which will be:

(a) to prohibit any heavy commercial vehicle, the maximum gross weight of which exceeds 7.5 tonnes, from proceeding in any of the roads or lengths of road specified in Schedule 1 to this Notice, and

(b) to revoke the County Council of Avon (Charlton Road and Chewton Road, Keynsham, District of Wansdyke) (Prohibition of Heavy Commercial Vehicles of over 7.5 Tonnes Maximum Gross Weight) Order 1988 the provisions of which are to be contained in this Order.

Exemptions are contained in the Order for vehicles to be used for or in connection with the conveyance of goods to or from any

premises situated on or adjacent to the road; for the purposes of agriculture; in connection with any building, industrial or demolition operation; the removal of obstruction to traffic; the maintenance of the road or services therein; in the service of a local authority or water authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties; to proceed to or from any premises situated on or adjacent to the road for the purposes of garaging or servicing the vehicle; for any fair, circus or similar event authorised by Wansdyke District Council and for fire brigade, police or ambulance purposes. Further exemptions are contained in the order for public service vehicles and school buses.

2. The County Council of Avon (High Street (B3116) and St. Ladoc Road, Keynsham, District of Wansdyke) (Prohibition of Driving of Heavy Commercial Vehicles of over 7.5 Tonnes Maximum Gross Weight) Order 199 under sections 1(1) and (2) and 2(1) to (4) the effect of which will be to prohibit any heavy commercial vehicle the maximum gross weight of which exceeds 7.5 tonnes from entering or proceeding in a southerly direction in the roads specified in Schedule 2 to this Notice (i.e. these vehicles will only be allowed to travel in a northerly direction towards Bristol Road/Station Road). An exemption in the Order will be provided for public service vehicles.

Full details of the proposals are contained in the draft Orders, which together with a map, a Statement of the Council's Reasons for proposing to make the Orders and a copy of the Order to be revoked, may be inspected at the undermentioned offices during normal office hours (callers should report to Reception and ask for the Statutory Orders Section) and at Keynsham Public Library, The Centre, Keynsham, Bristol during normal opening hours.

Objections to the proposals, together with the grounds on which they are made must be sent in writing to the County Solicitor and Deputy Clerk at the undermentioned address quoting reference DS/P/5/005 by 14th August 1992. Please note that all representations received may be considered in public by the County Council and that the substance of any representation together with the name and address of the person making it could become available for public inspection.
