Notice of application for consent in pursuance of section 88 and Schedule 10

Notice is hereby given, in accordance with section 88 and Schedule 10 of the Water Resources Act 1991, that an application has been made to the National Rivers Authority by Wessex Water Services Ltd., to enhance the capacity of Wedmore Sewage Treatment Works by increasing the volume treated and providing additional storage for storm sewage. Wessex Water Services Ltd., are undertaking improvements to the treatment works to improve the quality of the effluent and to cater for the increase in sewage flows to the treatment works that has taken place and projected future growth.

Application has been made to increase the amount of sewage effluent treated up to a dry weather flow of 454 cubic metres per day, discharging to the Landcourse Rhyne, in the River Axe catchment, at National Grid Reference ST 4390 4807. The quality of effluent treatment is being substantially improved to reduce the downstream water quality impact. When the sewage flow to the works exceeds 16 litres per second (1,367 cubic metres per day) due to rainfall screened sewage will be directed to storm tanks for settlement prior to overflow to the Landcourse Rhyne. This represents a substantial increase in the proportion of sewage treated under storm conditions.

ROAD TRAFFIC ACTS

BARNESLEY METROPOLITAN BOROUGH COUNCIL

The Metropolitan Borough of Barnsley (Parking Places and Controlled Parking Zone) (Barnsley) Order 1987 (Amendment No. 10) Order 1992.

(Central Area, Barnsley) (Traffic Regulation consolidation) Order 1987 (Amendment No. 7) Order 1992

Bus Stop Clearway (No. 1) Order 1992

Notice is hereby given that on 13th July 1992, the Barnsley Metropolitan Borough Council made the above-named Orders under the provisions of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (as amended).

The effect of the Orders which will come into operation on 20th July 1992, will be to:

- (i) introduce disabled persons parking places on part of the south-east side of Eldon Street;
- (ii) introduce pedestrianised provisions at Pool Square, prohibiting all vehicles except H.G.Vs and H.G.Vs requiring access for the purpose of loading, unloading and servicing shop premises, allowing waiting for a maximum period of 30 minutes return prohibited within two hours.
- (iii) introduce a 'Mobility' Bus Stop on the south-eastern side of Eldon Street; and
- (iv) prohibit vehicles waiting at any time in the designated Bus Stop area at the junction of Market Hill and Eldon Street.

By virtue of Regulation 25(3) of the Local Authorities Traffic Orders (Procedure) (England and Wales) Regulations 1989 the orders referred to herein give effect to the remaining provisions
