

B. Pasture Road and Pasture Avenue, Moreton (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1991

The effect of the Order will be to prohibit the waiting of vehicles at the times, lengths and sides of roads specified in the following Schedule:

SCHEDULE

No Waiting At Any Time in Lengths of Road in Moreton

1. *Pasture Road*, both sides from the north side of its junction with Pasture Avenue for a distance of 98 metres (322 feet) in a southerly direction.
2. *Pasture Avenue*, both sides, from its junction with Pasture Road for a distance of 28 metres (92 feet) in an easterly direction.

Exemptions will be provided in the above Orders to permit the picking up and unloading of goods, maintenance of roads, supply of gas electricity and water in pursuance of statutory powers and duties, and disabled persons parking, and hackney carriages to wait on authorised stands.

C. Hore Street New Brighton (One-way Traffic) Order 1992

The effect will be to prohibit the driving of vehicles in the length of road specified in column 1 of the following Schedule other than in a direction specified in column 2:

SCHEDULE

<i>Column 1</i> <i>Length of Road in New Brighton</i>	<i>Column 2</i> <i>Direction</i>
Hope Street from the west side of its junction with Grosvenor Road to its junction with Rowson Street	East to West

If you wish to question the validity of the Orders or of any provisions contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Act of 1984, as amended, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or of any Instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Orders you may within 6 weeks of the date of this notice apply to the High Court for this purpose.

WORCESTER CITY COUNCIL

The Worcester City Council (Parking Places) (Newport Street Car Park) Order 1992

Notice is hereby given that Worcester City Council propose to make an Order under section 35(1) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

The effect of the proposed Order will be to extend the provisions of the Worcester City Council (Parking Places) (Consolidation) Order 1988 as amended by the Off-Street Parking Places Orders specified in the Schedule to the proposed Order (the Consolidation Order) to cover the off-street parking place provided by the Council at the site of the former Newport Street Bus Station, Newport Street, Worcester (the Newport Street Car Park).

It is proposed that the Newport Street Car Park, in addition to the site of the former Newport Street Bus Station situate between Newport Street and Dolday, Worcester (referred to above), shall comprise the existing two off-street parking places situate at Newport Street and bounded in part by Newport Street and North Parade and Newport Street and Dolday respectively which are together referred to as "Newport Street/Dolday" in the Consolidation Order.

It is proposed that the Newport Street Car Park shall be used as a parking place for the following classes of vehicles, namely motor car, light commercial vehicle or motor cycle on the days and during the hours of operation and in accordance with the scale of charges specified below:

<i>Days and hours of operation</i>	<i>Scale of charges</i>
Mondays to Saturdays inclusive between 0730 hours and 1830 hours	30p per hour or part for the first 3 hours or part and £1.20 per day for any period in excess of 3 hours

<i>Days and hours of operation</i>	<i>Scale of charges</i>
Sundays between 0730 hours and 1830 hours	50p per day or part
All days between 1830 hours and 2400 hours	20p unless a ticket is purchased and displayed to cover the period up to 1830 hours

and that the maximum period for which vehicles may wait shall be a period not exceeding 23 hours in every period of 24 hours.

Full details of the proposals are in the draft of the proposed Order which, together with a copy of the Consolidation Order and a statement of the Council's reasons for the proposals and a map showing the location of the Newport Street Car Park, may be inspected at the offices of the City Solicitor and Deputy Town Clerk, Guildhall, Worcester WR1 2EY, and the Director of Technical Services, Farrier House, Farrier Street, Worcester WR1 3FS, between 8.30 a.m. and 4.30 p.m. Mondays to Fridays inclusive.

PLANNING (LISTED BUILDINGS AND CONSERVATION AREAS) ACT 1990

Notice of Designation of a Conservation Area at Almer, Wimborne, Dorset

Notice is hereby given, in pursuance of section 69 of the Planning (Listed Buildings and Conservation Areas) Act 1990, that the East Dorset District Council, after consultation with the Dorset County Council and Sturminster Marshall Parish Council, have determined that the area described in the Schedule to this notice is an area of special architectural or historic interest, the character or appearance of which it is desirable to preserve or enhance and have accordingly designated the said area as a conservation area.

The effect of the designation of the conservation area may be summarised as follows:

- (a) Where any application for planning permission for development of land in or adjacent to the conservation area is made to the Council and the development would, in the opinion of the Council, affect the character or appearance of the conservation area, the application will be subject to the special procedure in section 73 of the Planning (Listed Buildings and Conservation Areas) Act 1990.
- (b) Anyone wishing to demolish a building or a part of a building situate within the conservation area must first apply for consent to demolition to the Local Planning Authority. This is not taken to be included in a planning permission for redevelopment of the site unless, in granting the planning permission, the Authority states that it includes consent to demolish the building. Some buildings may be exempt from this requirement.
- (c) Anyone wishing to cut down, top, lop or uproot a tree situate within the conservation area must give 6 weeks' prior notice of his intention to the Local Planning Authority.

A map of the conservation area may be inspected, free of charge, during normal office hours at the office of the County Planning Officer at Dorset County Council, County Hall, Dorchester, or at the office of the District Planning Officer of East Dorset District Council, Council Offices, Furzehill, Wimborne, Dorset.
