

MID GLAMORGAN COUNTY COUNCIL

Mid Glamorgan County Council (Carno Street, Bryn Seion Street and Clarence Row, Rhymney) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1992

Notice is hereby given that the Mid Glamorgan County Council propose to make an Order under sections 1, 2 and 4 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the effect of which will be to prohibit the waiting of vehicles at any time on the lengths of roads and sides of lengths of road specified in the Schedule to this notice.

Exemptions will be provided for in the Order to enable Medical Practitioners and Veterinary Surgeons to visit while "on call" and for the purpose of boarding, alighting, loading and unloading, building and roadworks, the maintenance, improvement, reconstruction, inspection or survey of the lengths of roads and sides of lengths of road, the maintenance of essential services, weddings, funerals and the delivery or collection of postal packets by vehicles in the service of the Post Office. Disabled persons' vehicles displaying the relevant disabled person's badge will be allowed to wait for up to 2 hours with return prohibited within 1 hour.

A copy of the proposed Order, a statement of the Council's reasons for proposing to make the Order, and a map showing the lengths of roads and sides of lengths of road to which the proposed Order relates may be inspected at the offices of the Rhymney Valley District Council, Ystrad Fawr, Ystrad Mynach, and at the Mid Glamorgan County Hall, Cathays Park, Cardiff, during normal office hours.

Objections to the proposal, together with the grounds on which they are made must be sent in writing to the undersigned by 17th August 1992.

SCHEDULE

Lengths of roads and sides of lengths of road in the District of Rhymney Valley

- both sides of Bryn Seion Street, Rhymney, from its junction with the southern side of Carno Street, southwards for a distance of 15 metres (16 yards).
- both sides of Clarence Row, Rhymney, from its junction with the southern side of Carno Street, southwards for a distance of 15 metres (16 yards).
- the southern side of Carno Street, Rhymney, from a point 15 metres (16 yards) east of the eastern side of its junction with Bryn Seion Street, westwards to a point 15 metres (16 yards) west of the western side of its junction with Bryn Seion Street, a distance of approximately 40 metres (44 yards).
- the southern side of Carno Street, Rhymney, from a point 15 metres (16 yards) east of the eastern side of its junction with Clarence Row, westwards to a point 15 metres (16 yards) west of the western side of its junction with Clarence Row, a distance of approximately 43 metres (47 yards).
- the northern side of Carno Street, Rhymney, from a point 15 metres (16 yards) west of the western side of its junction with Bryn Seion Street, eastwards to a point 15 metres (16 yards) east of the eastern side of its junction with the un-named lane flanking "Sunningdale" and Ebenezer Chapel, a distance of approximately 57 metres (62 yards).

GLOUCESTERSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL

Gloucestershire County Council (A419 Stonehouse Court to North Berryfields, Stonehouse) (Prohibition of Driving) Order 1992

Notice is hereby given that on 17th July 1992, the Gloucestershire County Council made an Order under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the effect of which is to prohibit motor vehicles from proceeding over those areas of highway specified in the Schedule to this notice.

Exceptions in the Order apply to pedal cycles travelling on a designated cycle track.

A copy of the Order which will come into effect on 31st July 1992, together with the relevant plan may be inspected during normal office hours at the Gloucestershire County Council, Shire Hall, Westgate Street, Gloucester, and at the Public Library, Elm Road, Stonehouse, during the following opening times:

Saturday, 10 a.m. to 12 noon.

Any person wishing to question the validity of the Order or of any of its provisions on the ground that it is not within the powers of the relevant enabling Act or that a requirement of any such enabling Act or of any relevant regulations made thereunder has not been complied with may, within 6 weeks from the date on which the Order was made, make application for the purpose to the High Court.

Roads in Stonehouse

Bristol Road (A419), two irregular shaped areas situated between a point approximately 90 metres east of its junction with the east side of Church Lane and a point approximately 370 metres east of that junction and shown coloured red on the plan attached hereto.
Church Lane (41236), an irregular shaped area situated between its junction with the south side of Bristol Road and a point approximately 12 metres south of that junction and shown coloured green on the plan attached hereto.

GWENT COUNTY COUNCIL

Gwent County Council (Austin Road/Wern Road/Station Road, Sebastopol) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) Order 1992

Notice is hereby given that Gwent County Council, in exercise of their powers under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 and all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police have, on 23rd July 1992, made the above Order.

To revoke:

- Urban District Council of Pontypool (Austin Road, Sebastopol), (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1971;
- Torfaen Borough Council (Wern Road and Austin Road, Sebastopol), (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1978.

The Order will come into operation on 17th August 1992.

The effect of the Order will be:

- to prohibit waiting at all times on any of the lengths of roads specified in Schedule 1 to this notice.
- to restrict waiting between the hours of 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. (Monday to Friday) on that length of road specified in Schedule 2 to this notice.

Exemptions have been included in the Order to permit waiting for the purposes of:

- picking-up and setting-down passengers;
- loading or unloading goods;
- the maintenance of the roads;
- the supply of gas, water or electricity;
- for emergency purposes;
- local authority duties.

The Order and a map showing the affected roads may be inspected at the County Hall, Cwmbran, during normal office hours (Monday to Friday).

If you wish to question the validity of the Order, or of any provision contained in it, on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or of any Instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order, you may, within 6 weeks from 23rd July 1992, apply to the High Court for this purpose.

SCHEDULE 1

Prohibition of Waiting at any time

1. Austin Road

- North-west side for a distance of 10 metres from its junction with Station Road.
- South side for a distance of 37 metres from its junction with Wern Road.
- South-east side for a distance of 15 metres from its junction with Station Road.
