

## NORTHAMPTONSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL

*Northamptonshire County Council (A509 Wellingborough Road, Kettering and Isham Road, Pytchley) (40 m.p.h. Speed Limit) Order 1992*

Notice is hereby given that the Northamptonshire County Council propose to make an Order under sections 84(1) and (2) and Part III of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the effect of which is to prohibit anyone from driving a motor vehicle at a speed exceeding 40 m.p.h. in the lengths of A509 Wellingborough Road, Kettering, and Isham Road, Pytchley, as described in the Schedule below.

A copy of the proposed Order, together with a map showing the length of road to which it relates and a statement of the Council's reasons for proposing to make the Order, may be inspected at Kettering Library, Sheep Street, Kettering, during normal opening hours, or at the offices of the undersigned between the hours of 9 a.m. and 12 noon, and 2 p.m. and 4 p.m., on Mondays to Fridays inclusive.

## SCHEDULE

*Lengths of road to be 40 m.p.h.*

*A509. Wellingborough Road, Kettering, from a point 20 metres south of its junction with Patrick Road to a point 155 metres south of its junction with the A14 Interchange, including the whole of the Pytchley Road roundabout, the Venture Park roundabout, and the A14 Interchange roundabout.*

*Isham Road, Pytchley, from its junction with the A509/A14 Interchange for a distance of 90 metres in a southerly direction.*

## NOTTINGHAMSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL

*The Nottinghamshire County Council (Sutton-cum-Lound) (Weight Restriction) Order 1992 (432)*

Notice is hereby given that the Nottinghamshire County Council has made an Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended, the effect of which will be that no goods vehicle, the maximum gross weight of which exceeds 17 tonnes shall proceed in parts of the following roads at Sutton-cum-Lound, in the District of Bassetlaw:

*Sutton Lane, Station Road, Main Street, Town Street at Sutton, Mattersey Road, Lound Low Road, Town Street at Lound, and Little Top Lane.*

The usual exemptions will be provided. Relevant documents may be inspected at my office or at The Retford Library, Churchgate, Retford, Nottinghamshire.

Any person wishing to question the validity of the Order (which was made on 14th July 1992), or any of the provisions contained in it on the grounds that they are not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or any Instrument made under it, has not been complied with in relation to the Order may, within 6 weeks from 14th July 1992, apply to the High Court for this purpose.

The Order is made as described in the notice of proposal (ref. 481) which appeared in Issue No. 52789 of the *London Gazette*, dated 9th January 1992.

The prohibition is intended to reduce the environmental impact of heavy lorries on the villages of Sutton and Lound.

The Order will come into force on 19th August 1992.

*Length of Road in the Village of Trecastle in the Borough of Brecknock*

That length which extends from a point approximately 10 metres (11 yards) south of its junction with the county unclassified road No. U470, Brynawelon for a distance of approximately 140 metres (153 yards) in a generally southerly direction to a point immediately south of the southern abutments of Pont Logyn (spanning the Nant Logyn).
