TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1990

The Stopping-Up of Highways (Hinton Street, Splott, Cardiff, South Glamorgan) Order 1992

The Secretary of State for Wales hereby gives notice that he has made an Order under section 247 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 to authorise the stopping-up of the highway described in the Schedule to this Notice to enable the erection of a forecourt wall and railings for which planning permission has been granted, to be carried out.

The effect of the Order will be as described in notice 521 issue number 7222 of the *London Gazette* dated 24th April 1992.

Copies of the made Order and relevant plan may be inspected during office hours at the offices of Cardiff City Council, City Planning and Development Offices, Wood Street, Cardiff CF1 1PS, during a period of 6 weeks from 24th July 1992.

If any person desires to question the validity of the Order, or of any provisions contained therein; on the grounds:

- (a) that it is not within the powers of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990, or
- (b) that his interests have been substantially prejudiced by a failure to comply with any of the requirements of that Act,

he may within 6 weeks of 24th July 1992 apply to the High Court for the suspension of quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein.

SCHEDULE

(all distances are approximate)

The length of highway to be stopped up is at Splott, Cardiff, in the county of South Glamorgan. It is shown by zebra hatching on the deposited plan and is that area of footway immediately adjacent to the front of the property known as 24 Hinton Street, which extends from the eastern end of the existing forecourt wall of that property for a distance of 5 metres in a north-easterly direction and has a maximum width of 1.5 metres.
