COAST PROTECTION ACT 1949

WEST DORSET DISTRICT COUNCIL

Notice is hereby given that the West Dorset District Council, acting in its capacity as coast protection authority, under subsection (1) of section 5 of the above Act, proposes to carry out coast protection work as described herein at Lyme Regis, Dorset, between Cobb Gate (O.S. 3423, 9203) and Church Cliff (O.S. 3445, 9215) for a distance of 225 metres.

The estimated cost of the work is £4,000,000 and will consist of the following elements:

- (i) A 5-metre span, Voussoir reinforced concrete bridge over the River Lim, fronting the existing arch bridge by a distance of 25

metres seaward. All exposed surfaces of the new bridge to be faced with natural stone.

- (ii) A 40-metre length of concrete bed protection, to the mouth of the River Lim (known locally as "the Buddle").
- (iii) A 50-metre length of new reinforced concrete sea wall, from Cobb Gate car park to the west of the Buddle. All exposed surfaces of the wall to be faced with natural stone.
- (iv) A 110-metre length of new reinforced concrete sea wall, from immediately east of the Buddle to a point south of the Marine Theatre. The sea wall will incorporate 2,000 cubic metres of storage storm water. The roof of the storage tanks will form part of a new esplanade and access road from Cobb Gate to Church Cliff. All exposed surfaces of the wall to be faced with natural stone.
- (v) An 80-metre length of new reinforced concrete (box section) sea wall, from a point south of Marine Theatre to Church Cliff Jetty.
- (vi) Construction of a concrete slipway, immediately adjacent to Church Cliff Jetty.
- (vii) Construction of four sets of concrete steps, at identified locations along the sea walls, to provide access to the foreshore and beach (to include demolition and reconstruction of the structure known as Gun Cliff Jetty).
- (viii) Shallow stabilisation of the lower slopes of Church Cliff using drainage and landscaping.
- (ix) Beach reprofiling, in front of Church Cliff, using beach material excavated from the works.
- (x) Rock armouring protection to the seaward face of Cobb Gate car park sea wall, from Cobb Gate Jetty to west of the Buddle.
- (xi) Rock armouring protection, to all seaward faces of the new sea walls from east of the Buddle to a point immediately south of Church Cliff steps.

A plan and 1/200 scale model, showing the area of the proposed works, may be inspected, free of charge, at the council offices, 58-60 High West Street, Dorchester, Dorset, on Mondays to Fridays, during office hours.

SOUTH WIGHT BOROUGH COUNCIL
