The Gwent County Council (Ross Lane, Newport) One-way Traffic Order 1992

Notice is hereby given that the Gwent County Council, in exercise of their powers under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police, propose to make the above Order the effect of which will be:

To prohibit vehicles from proceeding in the length of road specified in column 1 of the Schedule to this notice in a direction other than that specified in relation to that length of road in column 2 of the said Schedule.

Full details of the proposals are in the draft Order which, together with a map showing the affected road and alternative route and a statement of the Council's reasons for proposing to make the Order, may be inspected at the County Hall, Cwmbran, and at the Civic Centre, Newport, during normal office hours (Monday to Friday).

HEREFORD AND WORCESTER COUNTY COUNCIL

The County of Hereford and Worcester (Footway joining Jacomb Drive and Jacomb Close, Lower Broadheath) (Prohibition of Cycling) Order 1992.

Notice is hereby given that, Hereford and Worcester County Council propose to make an Order under sections 1(1) and (2) and 2(1) to (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, and of all other enabling powers the effect of which will be to prohibit any person from riding any bicycle or tricycle on the footway joining Jacomb Drive and Jacomb Close in the Parish of Broadheath in the District of Malvern Hills in the county of Hereford and Worcester.

Full details of this proposal are contained in the draft Order which together with a map showing the footway affected and statement of the Council's reasons for proposing to make the Order may be examined from Monday to Friday during normal office hours at:

HEREFORD AND WORCESTER COUNTY COUNCIL

The County of Hereford and Worcester (The Flats and Santridge Lane, Bromsgrove) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) Order 1992.

Notice is hereby given that, Hereford and Worcester County Council propose to make an Order under sections 1(1) and (2), 2(1) to (3) and 4(2) of, and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, and of all other enabling powers the effect of which will be:

- (1) to prohibit waiting at any time on those sides of lengths of roads in the Town and District of Bromsgrove in the county of Hereford and Worcester specified in the Schedule to this notice;
- (2) to prohibit waiting between the hours of 8 a.m. and 4 p.m. Monday to Friday inclusive on the north-east of Santridge Lane in the Town and District of Bromsgrove in the county of Hereford and Worcester from a point 15 metres (49 feet) east of its junction with B4091, Stourbridge Road for a distance of 42 metres (138 feet) in a westerly and northerly direction.

Exemptions in the proposed Order will permit waiting for the purpose of:

- (a) picking up and setting down passengers;
- (b) loading and/or unloading goods;

- (c) delivering and collecting mail by Post Office vehicles;
- (d) delivering and collecting furniture and effects with police consent;
- (e) any building or demolition operation, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance of the roads and the supply and maintenance of any gas, electricity, water and telecommunications apparatus;
- (f) the fire brigade, ambulance or police services;
- (g) the pursuance of statutory powers or duties (if no other road can be conveniently used).

Exemptions in the Order also permit disabled persons' vehicles displaying a badge and parking disc issued under the Local Authority's Orange Badge Scheme to wait on the sides of lengths of roads referred to in item (1) of this notice for a maximum of 3 hours (return prohibited within one hour) and for an unlimited period on the side of length of road referred to in item (2) of this notice.

- (1) *The Flats* (both sides); from its junction with Santridge Lane for a distance of 15 metres (49 feet) in a westerly direction.
- (2) *Santridge Lane* (west side); from a point 15 metres (49 feet) south of its junction with The Flats to a point 15 metres (49 feet) north of that junction.
- (3) *Santridge Lane* (both sides); from its junction with B4091, Stourbridge Road for a distance of 15 metres (49 feet) in a westerly direction.

HEREFORD AND WORCESTER COUNTY COUNCIL

The County of Hereford and Worcester (Camp Road, Ross-on-Wye) (Weight Restriction) Order 1992

Notice is hereby given that, Hereford and Worcester County Council propose to make an Order under sections 1(1) and (2), 2(4) and 3(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 and of all other enabling powers, the effect of which will be that no person shall cause or permit any vehicle the gross weight of which exceeds 3.5 tonnes to proceed on Camp Road in the Town of Ross-on-Wye in the District of South Herefordshire in the County of Hereford and Worcester between its junction with Gloucester Road and its junction with Alton Road.

Exemptions are contained in the Order for vehicles of the following classes or for the following purposes if the vehicle:

- (a) is being used for or in connection with the conveyance of persons, goods, merchandise, furniture or effects;
- (b) is being used in any building or demolition operation, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance of the roads and the supply and maintenance of any gas, electricity, water and telecommunications apparatus;
- (c) is being used in an emergency for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes;
- (d) is being used to gain access for the services of a garage;
- (e) is being used in connection with a circus, fair or similar event which has been authorised by the Council;
- (f) is being used for or in connection with the conveyance of goods for sale from that vehicle;
- (g) is being used to gain access to any land or premises where there is not a satisfactory alternative means of vehicular access;
- (h) is a mechanical road cleansing vehicle'
- (i) is being used in pursuance of statutory powers or duties.

The alternative route for vehicles affected by this Order is via Alton Road and Gloucester Road.
