

Area boundary then follows the hedge north-eastwards for 140 metres to meet the hedge which runs parallel with Leicester Road. The boundary follows this hedge south-westwards for 310 metres to rejoin the commencement point. The key buildings and features in the Conservation Area are the bridges over the canal, Brownsover Hall, and its kitchen garden, stable blocks and mature landscaped grounds, St. Michael's Church and Lawrence Sheriff's house.

The total area covers 0.6 square kilometres.
