2. *Bittell Road, south side, from a point 15 metres (49 feet) west of its junction with Hewell Road to a point 15 metres (49 feet) east of that junction.*

HEREFORD AND WORCESTER COUNTY COUNCIL

The County of Hereford and Worcester (Perry Lane, Bromsgrove) (Experimental) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) Order 1992.

Notice is hereby given that Hereford and Worcester County Council have made an Order under section 9 of, and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, and of all other enabling powers the effect of which will be:

- (1) to prohibit waiting at any time on those sides of lengths of Perry Lane in the Town and District of Bromsgrove in the County of Hereford and Worcester specified in the Schedule to this notice;
- (2) to prohibit waiting on the south-eastern side of Perry Lane, Bromsgrove, from a point 10 metres (33 feet) south-west of its junction with Kidderminster Road to a point 33 metres (108 feet) south-west of that junction.
 - (i) for a period exceeding 1 hour;
 - (ii) return prohibited within 1 hour.

Exemptions in the proposed Order will permit waiting for the purpose of:

- (a) picking up and setting down passengers;
- (b) loading and/or unloading goods;
- (c) delivering and collecting mail by Post Office vehicles;
- (d) delivering and collecting furniture and effects with Police consent;
- (e) any building or demolition operation, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance of the roads and the supply and maintenance of any gas, electricity, water and telecommunications apparatus;
- (f) the fire brigade, ambulance or police services.
- (g) the pursuance of statutory powers or duties (if no other road can conveniently be used).

Exemptions in the Order also permit disabled persons' vehicles displaying a badge and parking disc issued under the Local Authority's Orange Badge Scheme to wait on the sides of lengths of roads specified in item (1) of this notice for a maximum of 3 hours (return prohibited within one hour), and for an unlimited time for the side of length of road specified in item (2).

The Experimental Order will come into force on 6th October 1992.

Full details of these proposals are contained in the Experimental Order which together with a map showing the road affected and a statement of the Council's reasons for making this Experimental Order, may be examined from Monday to Friday, during normal office hours at:

- (1) Bromsgrove District Council Offices, The Council House, Burcot Lane, Bromsgrove.
- (2) County Hall, Spetchley Road, Worcester.

Any person wishing to object to the making of a permanent Order continuing the Experimental Order must do so in writing to the undersigned, stating the grounds of objection, within a period of 6 months from 1st October 1992.

HEREFORD AND WORCESTER COUNTY COUNCIL

The County of Hereford and Worcester (Holiday Hall Lane, Kington) (Weight Restriction) Order 1992

Notice is hereby given that on 24th September 1992, Hereford and Worcester County Council, made an Order under sections 1(1) and (2), 2(4) and 3(2) of, and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, and of all other enabling powers the effect of which will be that no person shall cause or permit any vehicle the maximum gross weight of which exceeds 5 tonnes to proceed on that length of Holiday Hall Lane in the parish of Kington in the district of Leominster in the county of Hereford and Worcester, that extends from its junction with Church Street, to its junction with Common Close.

Exemptions are contained in the Order for vehicles of the following classes or for the following purposes if the vehicle:

- (a) is being used for or in connection with the conveyance of persons, goods, merchandise, furniture or effects;
- (b) is being used in any building or demolition operation, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance of the roads and the supply and maintenance of any gas, electricity, water and telecommunications apparatus;
- (c) is being used in an emergency for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes;
- (d) is being used for the purpose of agriculture in connection with land adjacent to the length of road or in the conveyance of timber felled upon that land;
- (e) is being used to gain access for the services of a garage;
- (f) is being used in connection with a circus, fair or similar event which has been authorised by the Council;
- (g) is being used for or in connection with the conveyance of goods for sale from the vehicle;
- (h) is being used to gain access to any land or premises where there is not a satisfactory alternative means of vehicular access;
- (i) is a mechanical road cleansing vehicle;
- (j) is being used in pursuance of statutory powers or duties.

The alternative route for vehicles affected by the Order is via Church Street, The Square and Common Close.

The Order will come into operation on 5th October 1992.

A copy of the Order as made and a copy of the relevant map can be inspected at County Hall, Spetchley Road, Worcester, during normal office hours.

Any person who desires to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained in the Order on the ground that it is not within the powers of the relevant section of the Act or on the ground that any requirement of that section or of Parts I, II or III of Schedule 9 to the Act of 1984, or of any regulations made under the said Part III of Schedule 9 have not been complied with in relation to the Order, may within 6 weeks of the date on which the Order was made (such date stated in this notice) make application for the purpose to the High Court.
