The County of Durham (Unclassified Garden Terrace, Leadgate) (Prohibition of Driving) Order 1992

Notice is hereby given that the Durham County Council have made an Order under sections 1(1) and (2), 2(1) to (3) and 3(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

The effect of the Order which comes into operation on 5th October 1992, will prohibit the driving of any motor vehicle on the industrial estate access road from the junction with Garden Place, in a north-westerly direction for a distance of 1 metre.

The County of Durham (Unclassified Durham Lane/Clappersgate Junction, Easington Village) (Prohibition of Entry) Order 1992

Notice is hereby given that the Durham County Council have made an Order under sections 1(1) and (2), 2(1) to (3) and 3(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

The effect of the Order which comes into operation on 5th October 1992, will prohibit any vehicle from entering Clappersgate from the south—its junction with Durham Lane.

The Order contains exemptions in respect of street cleansing vehicles and police, fire brigade and ambulance vehicles being used in emergencies.

The County of Durham (Borough of Darlington) (Woodland Road/Vane Terrace) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1992

Notice is hereby given that the Durham County Council have made an Order under sections 1(1) and (2), 2(1) to (3) and 4(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the effect of which is as set out in the Schedule hereto.

The Order which comes into operation on 5th October 1992, contains exemptions in respect of boarding or alighting; loading or unloading of goods; buildings operations and demolitions; removal of obstructions to traffic, maintenance of the road; Post Office vehicles; fire brigade, police or ambulance vehicles; statutory powers and disabled persons.

A copy of the Order, together with a map showing the affected roads, may be inspected at the office of the Borough Solicitor and Head of Administrative Services at the Town Hall, Darlington, during normal office hours on Monday to Friday.

Any person who wishes to question the validity of the Order or of any of the provisions contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the relevant section of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or on the ground that any requirement of that section of the said Act of 1984, or of Parts I, II and III of Schedule 9 to the said Act or of any regulation made under the said Part III have not been complied with in relation to the Order, may, within 6 weeks from 2nd October 1992, apply to the High Court for that purpose.

To prohibit the waiting of any vehicle at any time on the following length of roads:

Woodland Road, on the south side from a point 5 metres west of its junction with Vane Terrace, to a point 15 metres east of its junction with Vane Terrace; and

Vane Terrace, on both sides from its junction with Woodland Road, southwards for a distance of 15 metres.

The Chester-le-Street (Various Streets) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1968 be amended as follows:

In Part 1 of Schedule, delete

'Both Sides of Road A6127 from junction with unclassified road leading to Hillside continuing southwards along Newcastle Road, Front Street, Red Rose and Ivanhoe Terraces, to junction with unclassified road leading to Weldon Terrace, for a total distance of approximately 1,382 yards'.

and insert

'Both sides of Road A6127 for junction with unclassified road leading to Hillside continuing southwards along Newcastle Road, Front Street, Red Rose to junction with unclassified road leading to Weldon Terrace and Ivanhoe Terrace southwards to boundary between Nos. 2-3'.

SCHEDULE 2

The Chester-le-Street (Various Streets) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1969 be amended as follows:

In Part 1 of Schedule, delete

'West side of Road A6127 from Nos. 5 and 6 Ivanhoe Terrace, southwards for a distance of 94 yards to junction with Clifford Terrace'.

and insert

'West side of Road A6127 from the junction with Clifford Terrace northwards on Ivanhoe Terrace for a distance of 21 metres'.
