#### POWYS COUNTY COUNCIL

*The County of Powys (Access Road to Banwy Industrial Estate, Llanfair Caereinion) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1992*

Notice is hereby given that on 1st October 1992, the County Council of Powys made the above-named Order under sections 1(1) and (2) 2(1) and (2) and 4(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

This Order, which will come into operation on Monday, 5th October 1992, makes it unlawful to leave a vehicle at any time along either sides of the length of road in the Community of Llanfair Caereinion specified in the Schedule to this notice.

Exceptions in the Order permit waiting for as long as it is reasonably necessary for the following purposes:

- (a) picking up and setting down passengers;
- (b) loading or unloading goods;
- (c) building and demolition operations and
- (d) carrying out essential works connected with the maintenance of the road and the provision of water, gas, electricity and telecommunications services.

The Order also contains an exception permitting disabled persons' vehicles to park for periods not exceeding 3 hours with return within 1 hour prohibited.

*Access Road to Banwy Industrial Estate, Llanfair Caereinion*

The north side thereof which extends from its junction with the A458 Trunk Road Pool Road near the terminus of the Welshpool and Llanfair Light Railway in a generally easterly direction for a distance of approximately 69 metres.

#### SCHEDULE

*Lengths of Road at Abertridwr in the Community of Llanwddyn*

(1) *County Class II Road No. B4393 Llanfyllin to Lake Yrnywy Road*, that length which extends from a point approximately 365 metres south of its junction with the B4396 Penybontfawr Road (i.e. at a point approximately 35 metres south of Sardis Manse) for a distance of approximately 510 metres in a generally northerly and then westerly direction to a point approximately 145 metres west of its junction with the said B4396 (i.e. at a point approximately 20 metres west of Llanwddyn Telephone Exchange).

(2) *County Class II Road No. B4396 Llanwddyn to Penybontfawr Road*, that length which extends from its junction with the B4393 at Llanwddyn Football Ground for a distance of approximately 511 metres in a north-easterly direction to a point approximately 50 metres north-east of its junction with the access to Abermarchnant Bungalow. #### POWYS COUNTY COUNCIL

*The County of Powys (Brook Street, Welshpool) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1992*

Notice is hereby given that on 1st October 1992, the County Council of Powys made the above-named Order under sections 1(1) and (2) 2(1) and (2) and 4(2) and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

This Order, which will come into operation on Monday 5th October 1992, makes it unlawful to leave a vehicle:

- (i) at any time along the side of the length of road known as Brook Street, Welshpool, specified in Schedule I to this notice; and
- (ii) between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. on any day along the side of the length of the said Brook Street, Welshpool specified in Schedule II to this notice.

Exceptions to the Order permit waiting for as long as it is reasonably necessary for the following purposes:

- (a) picking up and setting down passengers;
- (b) loading or unloading goods;
- (c) building and demolition operations and

*County Classified Road No. B4381; Brook Street, Welshpool*
