Gwent County Council (Blackwood Town Centre and other Roads, Pontllanfraith) (Traffic Regulation) Order 1992

Notice is hereby given that the Gwent County Council, in exercise of their powers under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, propose to make the above Order the general effect of which will be:

 To revoke or retain certain prohibition and restriction of waiting, right turns, disabled persons parking, hackney carriage parking Orders and parts of Orders affecting various roads in Blackwood Town Centre and Pontllanfraith areas.

To prohibit waiting at any time on the lengths of roads and parts of roads as set out below:

- A4048 High Street, Cefn Road, Holly Place, Hillside Terrace, Pentwyn Road, Woodbine Road, The Square, Highland Terrace, Gordon Road, Garfield Street, Albion Terrace, Ladysmith Road, Lilian Road, Wesley Road, Fairfield Close, Libanus Road, Bridge Street Car Park access road, Williams Street, George Street, David Street, Cliff Road, Bridge Street, Hall Street, Market Square access road, Supermarket Car Park access road, Un-named service lane adjacent to Market Square access road, un-named service lane off Gravel Lane, Gravel Lane, Market Square, Blackwood and Brynhyfryd Street, Pontlanfraith.
- To prohibit waiting between the hours of 8 a.m., and 6 p.m., on any day, on parts of: A4048 High Street, and Pentwyn Road, Blackwood and A4048 Blackwood Road, Pontllanfraith.
- To prohibit waiting between the hours of 8 a.m., and 6 p.m., Monday to Saturday on parts of: A4048 High Street, Lilian Road, Woodbine Road, Williams Street and Albion Terrace, Blackwood.
- To restrict waiting to 30 minutes (no return within 1 hour) between the hours of 8 a.m., and 6 p.m., Monday to Saturday on parts of: A4048 High Street and Market Square access road, Blackwood.
- To restrict waiting to 40 minutes (no return within 20 minutes) between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m., on any day, on parts of: Pentwyn Road, Blackwood.

Exemptions will be provided in the Order to permit waiting for the following purposes:

- (a) Picking up and setting down passengers.
- (b) Loading and unloading goods.
- (c) The maintenance of the roads.
- (d) The supply of gas, water or electricity.
- (e) For emergency purposes.
- (f) Local authority duties.
- To prohibit driving (except for access) on parts of: Gravel Lane and un-named service lane at the rear of 112-132 High Street. Blackwood.
- 8. To introduce a One-way Traffic Order on the following lengths of roads:

Cefn Road from its junction with the Square to its junction with Bloomfield Road and South View Road, in a south to north direction.

Un-named service lane adjacent to The Market Square access road from its junction with Market Square access road to its junction with Gordon Road, in a north to south direction.

9. To prohibit right hand turns on the length of roads as set out below:

South-western corner of The Square at its junction with the two-way carriageway of The Square.

Bridge Street, at its junction with the A4048 High Street.

Unnamed service road adjacent to Market Square access road, at its junction with Gordon Road.

 To introduce Disabled Persons Parking Places on A4048 High Street, Blackwood.

Full details of these proposals are in the draft Order which together with a map showing the restricted roads and a written statement of the Council's reasons for proposing to make the Order may be inspected at the offices of the Civic Centre, Pontllanfraith and the County Hall, Cwmbran, during normal office hours (Monday to Friday).

If you wish to object to the proposed Order you should send the grounds for your objection in writing to the undersigned by 30th October 1992.

The Halton Borough Council (Warrington Road, Moore)
(Prohibition of Driving) Order 1992

Notice is hereby given that on 30th September 1992, Halton Borough Council, as agents for Cheshire County Council, made an Order under sections 1 and 2 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the effect of which is to prohibit the driving of vehicles, except pedal cycles, in Warrington Road, Moore, from its junction with the Sandymoor access road for a distance of 130 metres in an easterly direction.

The Order will become operational on 12th October 1992.

The Order contains exemptions for the purposes of building operations, removal of any obstruction of traffic, the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the said road or the laying, alteration or repair, in or on land adjacent to the said road of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water, electricity or telecommunications apparatus.

A copy of the Order and relevant map may be inspected at the Municipal Building, Kingsway, Widnes; the Information Centre, Church Street, Runcorn, and the Town Hall, Heath Road, Runcorn, during normal office hours.

Any person who desires to question the validity of the Order or any provision contained in it on the grounds that the Order is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 or on the ground that any Instrument made under it as not been complied with in relation to the Order, may within 6 weeks from 8th October 1992, apply to the High Court for this purpose.

HEREFORD AND WORCESTER COUNTY COUNCIL

The County of Hereford and Worcester (B4399, Holme Lacy Road, Hereford) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) Order 1992

Notice is hereby given that on 30th September 1992, Hereford and Worcester County Council made an Order under sections 1(1) and (2), 2(1) to (3) and 4(2) of the Road Traffic Regultion Act 1984, and of all other enabling powers the effect of which will be:

- to prohibit waiting at any time on those sides of lengths of road in the city of Hereford in the county of Hereford and Worcester specified in the Schedule to this notice;
- (2) to prohibit waiting between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. Monday to Friday inclusive, on the southern side of B4399, Holme Lacy Road in the City of Hereford in the county of Hereford and Worcester from a point 34 metres (112 feet) east of its junction with A49, Ross Road for a distance of 36 metres (118 feet) in an easterly direction.

Exemptions in the Order will permit waiting for the purpose of:

- (a) picking up and setting down passengers;
- (b) loading and/or unloading goods;
- (c) delivering and collecting mail by Post Office vehicles;
- (d) delivering and collecting furniture and effects with Police consent;
- (e) any building or demolition operation, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance of the roads and the supply and maintenance of any gas, electricity, water and telecommunications apparatus;
- (f) the fire brigade, ambulance or police services;
- (g) the pursuance of statutory powers or duties (if no other road can conveniently be used).

Exemptions in the Order also permit disabled persons' vehicles displaying a badge and parking disc issued under the Local Authority Orange Badge Scheme to wait on the sides of lengths of road for a maximum of 3 hours (return within one hour) in relation to (1) and for an unlimited time in relation to (2).

The Order will come into operation on 12th October 1992.

A copy of the Order as made and a copy of the relevant map can be inspected at County Hall, Spetchley Road, Worcester, during normal office hours.

Any person who desires to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained in the Order on the ground that it is not within the powerrs of the relevant section of the Act or on the ground that any requirement of that section or of Parts I, II or III of Schedule 9 to the Act of 1984 or of any regulations made under the said Part III of Schedule 9 have not been complied with in relation to
