Any person who desires to question the validity of the Orders or of any provision contained in them, on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act, or of any Instrument made under it, has not been complied with in relation to the Orders, may, within 6 weeks from the date of the making of the Orders, apply to the High Court for this purpose.
