

GATESHEAD METROPOLITAN BOROUGH COUNCIL

The Borough Council of Gateshead (Egremont Drive, Gateshead) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1992

Notice is hereby given that the Borough Council of Gateshead propose to make an Order under section 1(1) and (2), 2(1) and (2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

The effect of the proposed Order will be to introduce a No Waiting at anytime restriction on both sides of Egremont Drive, Gateshead, extending from its junction with Sheriffs Highway for a distance of 35 metres and on the west side of Sheriffs Highway from a point 10 metres north of its junction with Egremont Drive to a point 10 metres south of the same junction.

Normal exceptions would apply, including those for disabled persons vehicles.

The Borough Council of Gateshead (Kells Lane/Beacon Lough Road, Low Fell) (Boxed Area) Order 1992

Notice is hereby given that the Borough Council of Gateshead propose to make an Order under section 1(1) and (2), 2(1) and (2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

The effect of the proposed Order will be to introduce a boxed area restriction at the junction of Kells Lane and Beacon Lough Road, Low Fell, which will prevent any vehicle entering the boxed area unless its exit is clear.

The Borough Council of Gateshead (Ryton-Crawcrook Bypass) (Beweshill/Summerhill) (Prohibition of Driving) Order 1992

Notice is hereby given that on 15th October 1992 the Borough Council of Gateshead made an Order under section 1(1) and (2), 2(1) to (3) and 4(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

The effect of the Order, which comes into operation on 18th October 1992, will be to prevent any vehicle from proceeding from:

- (a) Beweshill Lane onto the Unnamed Link Road between Beweshill and Summerhill and
- (b) the above named Unnamed Link Road onto Beweshill Lane.

MID GLAMORGAN COUNTY COUNCIL

Mid Glamorgan County Council (Quarella Road and Quarella Crescent, Bridgend) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1992

Notice is hereby given that the Mid Glamorgan County Council propose to make an Order under sections 1, 2 and 4 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the effect of which will be to prohibit the waiting of vehicles at any time on the side of length of road and length of road specified in the Schedule to this notice.

Exemptions will be provided in the Order to enable Medical Practitioners and Veterinary Surgeons to visit while "on call" and for the purposes of boarding, alighting, loading and unloading, building and road works, the maintenance, improvement, reconstruction, inspection or survey of the side of length of road and length of road for the maintenance of essential services, weddings, funerals and the delivery or collection of postal packets by vehicles in the service of the Post Office. Disabled persons' vehicles displaying the relevant disabled person's badge will be allowed to wait for up to 3 hours with return prohibited within 1 hour.

Side of length of road and length of road in the Borough of Ogwr

- (a) eastern side of Quarella Road, from a point 15 metres south of its junction with Quarella Crescent, northwards, to its junction with Cemetery Road, a distance of approximately 190 metres (280 yards);
- (b) both sides of Quarella Crescent, Bridgend, from its junction with Quarella Road, westwards, for a distance of approximately 15 metres (16 yards).

MID GLAMORGAN COUNTY COUNCIL

Mid Glamorgan County Council (Quarella Crescent, Bridgend) (Prohibition of Entry) Order 1992

Notice is hereby given that the Mid Glamorgan County Council propose to make an Order under sections 1, 2 and 3 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the effect of which will be to prohibit vehicles from entering Quarella Crescent, Bridgend, unless requiring access to premises on or adjacent to that road.

Exemptions will be provided in the Order for the purposes of building, industrial or demolition operations, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of a road, the maintenance of essential services in pursuance of statutory powers or duties, and by emergency service vehicles.
