SOMERSET COUNTY COUNCIL**The County of Somerset (Roads at Sparkford) (Restricted Roads and 40 m.p.h. Speed Limit) Order 1992.**

SOUTH SOMERSET DISTRICT COUNCIL**The District of South Somerset (Parking Place) (Millbrook Gardens, Castle Cary) Order 1992**

Notice is hereby given that on 22nd October 1992, the South Somerset District Council have made an Order under section 35(1) and (3) and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, pursuant to arrangements made with the highway authority, the Somerset County Council, under section 101 of the Local Government Act 1972 and after consulting the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act the effects of which are as set out below from 23rd October 1992:

1. To authorise the Millbrook Gardens Car Park, Castle Cary, as a public off-street parking place for the purposes of the above Act.

- To permit the use of the car park free of charge during all days and all hours.
- To limit the maximum continuous period which any vehicle may wait in the car park to 24 consecutive hours.
- To restrict the use of the car park to the following classes of vehicles:

Motor car licensed as private;

Goods vehicle the unladen weight of which does not exceed 1,525 kilogrammes (1.5 tons);

Motor cycle with or without side car;

Invalid carriage; and

Buses and coaches (only in bays specifically marked out for the use of such vehicles).

- To impose a penalty charge of £25 for the offences set out below and to make regulations as to the payment of the charge:

Offences

Unauthorised parking in an area or bay set aside for special use, i.e. disabled persons bay; parking a vehicle of an unauthorised class weight; parking for longer than permitted and parking outside of a marked bay.

- To make provision whereby, if a sum of £15 is tendered within 7 working days of an offence, as described in 5 above, having been committed, such sum may be accepted in satisfaction of the penalty charge.
- To make provisions to authorise the Council to regulate the use of the parking place; suspend the use of the parking place at any time; make provisions as to the giving of information by a person keeping a vehicle or any other person in respect of a vehicle in a parking place and to arrange for the removal and disposal of vehicles left in the parking place in certain circumstances where they are left in contravention of the Order.

Further details, including copies of the Order, together with a map of the car park and a statement of reasons for having made the Order may be inspected free of charge and at all reasonable hours at the following places:

- The Reception, Council Offices, Brympton Way, Yeovil; and
- The Post Office, Bailey Hill, Castle Cary.

Any person who desires to question the validity of the Order or of any provisions contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Act of 1984, or on the grounds that any requirement or Instrument made under that Act has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may, within 6 weeks of the date on which the Order was made, make application for the purpose to the High Court.

ST. EDMUNDSBURY BOROUGH COUNCIL**Temporary Closure of Chalkstone Way, Manor Road, Millfields Way in the Parish of Haverhill**

Notice is hereby given that the St. Edmundsbury Borough Council intends not less than 7 days after the date of this notice to make an Order closing Chalkstone Way, Manor Road and Millfields Way to allow the construction of Road Humps.

The works will be carried out in sections to avoid the closures occurring at the same time.

Provision will be made for the passage at all times of pedestrians and cyclists and vehicular access to all properties will be maintained.

During the period of closure as work progresses traffic will be diverted to open sections of Chalkstone Way, Manor Road and Millfields Way. These measures will be implemented only as indicated by the required signs at the time.

It is intended that the roads will be closed for a period of 6 weeks commencing on 2nd November 1992. However, if necessary, the Order may remain in force for 18 months (or longer, if extended by the Secretary of State).
