DYFED COUNTY COUNCIL

The County of Dyfed (The Paragon Gut, Tenby) (Experimental Prohibition of Driving) Order 1992

Notice is hereby given that on 19th October 1992, the Dyfed County Council made an Order under sections 9 and 10 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984. The effect of this Order is:

1. To prohibit any vehicle from proceeding along that length of road known as the Paragon Gut between its junction with St. Mary's Street and its junction with Lower Frog Street at any time on any day.

To suspend:

- (a) *The County of Pembroke (Various Street, Tenby) (One-way) Order 1963; and*
- (b) *The County of Dyfed (Walled Town, Tenby) (Seasonal Prohibition of Motor vehicles) Order 1989* in so far as they relate to the length of road referred to in 1 above.

The Order contains exemptions for access by emergency vehicles, for the performance of statutory powers or duties and for vehicles given express authorisation for access by or on behalf of Dyfed County Council, South Pembrokeshire District Council or the Chief Officer of Police for that area.

The Order will come into operation on 31st October 1992, and a copy of the Order, containing full particulars together with a map indicating the length of road affected and a statement of the council's reasons for making an Experimental Order may be inspected at the offices of the Dyfed County Council at County Hall, Carmarthen and at the offices of Tenby Town Council, De Valence Pavilion, Upper Frog Street, Tenby, during the usual office hours.

After an initial period of 6 months the Council will then consider whether the provisions of the Order are to be continued in force indefinitely. If you wish to object to the making of a permanent Order on the terms of the Experimental Order then you should send the grounds for your objection in writing to the undersigned by 10th May 1993.

Any person who desires to question the validity of this Order or of any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Act or on the grounds that any requirement of the Act or of any Instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order may, within 6 weeks of the date on which the Order was made, apply to the High Court for this purpose.
