

NORTH YORKSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL

North Yorkshire County Council (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting, Parking Provision and Prohibition of Driving) (Various Roads, Richmond) Order 1992

Notice is hereby given that on the 20th October 1992, North Yorkshire County Council made an Order under sections 1(1) and (2), 2(1) to (3), 4(2) and 32 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the effect of which is to:

1. Revoke "The Council of the County of North Yorkshire (various Roads, Richmond) (Extension of Waiting Restrictions and Consolidation) Order 1985" and "The Council of the County of North Yorkshire (Various Roads, Richmond) (Extension of Waiting Restrictions and Consolidation) (Amendment) Order 1986".
2. To remake the Orders in their entirety with the following addition to Schedule 2; waiting prohibited between 8 a.m. and 6 p.m., Monday to Saturday, inclusive:

Roads in the Town of Richmond

Richmond-Catterick Bridge, Class 1 County Road A6136, Station Road, south side from a point 12 metres south-west of the centre line of the access to the car park opposite Richmond Lower School eastwards for distance of 125 metres (the restriction fronting the school lay-by applies to carriageway only).

The proposed Order includes an exemption to allow buses to wait in the marked bay which is situated on the south side of Station Road and extends from a point 20 metres east of its junction with Frenchgate eastwards for a distance of 55 metres.

A copy of the Order which comes into operation on 26th October 1992, together with a map showing the roads affected may be examined at County Hall, Northallerton, and at The No. 1 Highways Divisional Office, 18 Green Howards Road, Richmond, North Yorkshire DL10 4NR, during normal office hours.

If you wish to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained in it, on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act, or of any Instrument made under it, has not been complied with in relation to the Order, you may, within 6 weeks of 24th October 1992, make application to the High Court for the purpose.

North Yorkshire County Council (Restriction of Waiting) (The Village Strensall) Order 1992

Notice is hereby given that on 20th October 1992, North Yorkshire County Council, made an Order under sections 1(1) and (2), 2(1) to (3) and 4(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the effect of which is to prohibit the waiting of vehicles (except for certain exempted purposes including the loading and unloading of goods between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m., Monday to Saturday in any length of road as specified below:

Road in the Parish of Strensall

The Village, south side, from its junction with Southfields Road, eastwards for a distance of 47 metres and westwards for a distance of 58 metres.

A copy of the Order which comes into operation on 24th October 1992, together with a map showing the road affected may be examined at County Hall, Room 7, Northallerton, and at the No. 12 Highways Divisional Office, Ox Carr Lane, Strensall, York during normal hours.

If you wish to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained in it, on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act, or of any Instrument made under it, has not been complied with in relation to the Order, you may, within 6 weeks of 23rd October 1992, make application to the High Court for the purpose.

The Borough of Trafford (Off-street Parking Places) (No. 1) Order 1992 (Amendment) Order 1992
