  - Stanley Road, extending from its junction with Manchester Road for a distance of 30 metres in a north-westerly direction, both sides.
  - Old Lane, extending from its junction with Manchester Road for a distance of 20 metres in a north-westerly direction, both sides.
  - Spencer Street, extending from its junction with Manchester Road for a distance of 40 metres in a north-westerly direction, both sides.
