Length of Market Parade, Havant wherein driving is to be prohibited

From its junction with Elm Lane to the northern boundary of No. 13 Market Parade.

SCHEDULE II

Length of Market Parade, Havant wherein driving is to be prohibited except for Access

From its junction with North Street to the northern boundary of No. 13 Market Parade.

SCHEDULE III

Length of Market Parade, Havant wherein waiting is to be prohibited

- (a) On the north side from its junction with North Street westwards a distance of 16 metres.
- (b) On the south side from its junction with North Street westwards a distance of 21 metres.
- (c) On the north side from a point 34 metres west from its junction with North Street westwards to the northern boundary of No. 13 Market Parade, including the "kidney" adjacent to the pedestrian precinct.
- (d) On the south side from a point 37 metres west from its junction with North Street, westwards to a point opposite the northern boundary of No. 13 Market Parade.

The Hertfordshire (Kiln Ground, Crofts Path and Goldcroft, Hemel Hempstead) (Prohibition of Entry and Driving) Order 1992
