

Waiting limited—10 a.m. to 7 p.m. (30 minutes)

Holdenhurst Road

- (i) south-eastern side from a point 123 metres north-east of the centre line of Northcote Road for 4 metres in a south-westerly direction.
- (ii) south-eastern side from a point 9 metres south-west of the centre line of Lytton Road for 2 metres in a south-westerly direction.
- (iii) south-eastern side from a point 9 metres south-west of the centre line of Victoria Place for 6 metres in a south-westerly direction.
- (iv) south-eastern side from a point 10 metres north-east of the centre of Victoria Place for 10 metres in a north-easterly direction.
- (v) south-eastern side from a point 10 metres north-east of Cleveland Road for 7 metres in a south-westerly direction.

(One-way Traffic) Order 1992*

Notice is hereby given that on 27th October 1992, the Clwyd County Council made the above-named Order under sections 1(1) and (2) and 2(1) to (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the effect of which is to prohibit any vehicle from proceeding in the length of road specified in column 1 of the Schedule to this notice in a direction other than that specified in column 2 of the said Schedule.

A copy of the Order, which will come into operation on the 2nd November 1992, and a map showing the length of road to which the Order relates may be examined at the Shire Hall, Mold during normal office hours.

If you wish to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or of any Instrument made under it, has not been complied with in relation to the Order, you may, within 6 weeks from 27th October 1992, apply to the High Court for this purpose.

CREWE AND NANTWICH BOROUGH COUNCIL

Borough of Crewe and Nantwich (General) (Off-street Parking Places) Order 1992

Notice is hereby given that the Crewe and Nantwich Borough Council proposes to make an Order under section 35 and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, and of all other enabling powers, with the consent of the County Council of Cheshire in accordance with section 39(3) of the Act and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act.

The effect of this Order will be to:

- (a) restrict waiting on the car parks shown in column 1 of the Schedule to this notice to the periods and on the days shown in column 2 of the Schedule to this notice.
- (b) impose a charge for a vehicle left in any of the car parks referred to in column 1 of the Schedule to this notice at the rate of 20p per hour (up to the maximum waiting time as shown in column 2 of the Schedule to this notice), between the hours of

8 a.m. to 6 p.m. on the days shown in column 2 of the Schedule to this notice. Parking will be free after 6 p.m. and before 8 a.m. and all day Sunday.

- (c) impose an excess charge of £15 on vehicles which are (i) left waiting in any of the car parks for a period in excess of that paid for or (ii) for a period in excess of that shown in column 2 of the Schedule to this notice or (iii) other than wholly within a marked bay.
- (d) revoke any current Off-street Parking Places Orders in so far as they relate to any of the car parks referred to in the Schedule to this notice.

NOTE: The Market Square, Heath Street, Crewe Car Park will operate on Tuesdays, Thursdays and Sundays only and the Market Area, Churchyardside, Nantwich Car Park will operate on Wednesdays, Fridays and Sundays only. The other named car parks will operate on all days.

Full details showing these proposals are contained in the draft Order which, together with maps showing the restricted areas and a statement of reasons for making the Order, may be examined during the normal office hours at the Information Centre, Beam Street, Nantwich, and the offices of the Head of Legal Services, 7th Floor, Delamere House, Delamere Street, Crewe, Cheshire, and at the Reception Desk, Municipal Buildings, Earle Street, Crewe.

If you wish to object to the proposed Order you should send the grounds of your objection in writing to the Head of Legal Services by 26th November 1992.
