# Revocations

Extent of Revocation

The Trunk Road (Various Roads, Lancaster) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting, Loading and Unloading) Order 1974.

- (a) The reference in Schedule 1 to the Order as far as it relates to Parliament Street.
- (b) The whole of Schedule 3.

#### SCHEDULE 2

Waiting prohibited at any time in length of Road in the City of Lancaster.

#### Lancaster

### Parliament Street

- North-westerly side from its junction with Cable Street to a point 30 metres north-east of its junction with Bulk Road.
- (ii) North-westerly side from a point 113 metres north-east of its junction with Bulk Road to its junction with Kingsway.
- (iii) South-easterly side from its junction with Cable Street to its junction with Bulk Road.
- (iv) South-easterly side from a point 157 metres east of its junction with Bulk Road to its junction with Kingsway.
- Owen Road, both sides, from a point 36 metres south-west of its junction with Pinfold Lane for a distance of 10 metres in a south-westerly direction.

## SCHEDULE 3

Waiting Limited to 1 hour, return prohibited within 1 hour 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. in length of Road in the City of Lancaster

## Lancaster

Parliament Street, north-westerly side from a point 30 metres northeast of its junction with Bulk Road for a distance of 83 metres in a north-easterly direction.

# SCHEDULE 4

Prohibition of Driving in length of Road in the City of Lancaster

- (a) Owen Road (part): That part of the easterly leg of Owen Road from a point 46 metres or thereabouts south-west of its junction with Pinfold Lane to its junction with the westerly leg of Owen Road (A6).
- (b) Parliament Street (part): That part of Parliament Street from its junction with Owen Road, being 25 metres or thereabouts in length and 6 metres or thereabouts in width situated between the westerly kerb-line and the central traffic island at the junction with Owen Road and Kingsway.

# SCHEDULE 5

One-way Driving Order in length of Road in the City of Lancaster Lancaster

Parliament Street: That length of Parliament Street which extends from its junction with Owen Road for a distance of 25 metres in a southerly direction. Direction of Flow: North to south.

### SCHEDULE 6

Bus and Cycle Lane Order in length of Road in the City of Lancaster

## Lancaster

Parliament Street: From a point 35 metres or thereabouts south of its junction with Owen Road to its junction with Bulk Road.

Direction of Bus and Cycle Traffic Flow: North-east to south-west.

N.B. This Order amends the existing Order which relates to that part of Parliament Street, in that the authorised traffic flow from south-west to north-east is retained for all traffic but a bus and cycle lane will operate in the opposite direction.

The Leicester Traffic Regulation (Amendment) (Carts Lane/Loseby Lane) (No. 482) Order 1992

Notice is hereby given that Leicester City Council as Agents authorised by Leicestershire County Council have made the following Orders under sections 1 and 2 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 to come into operation on 9th November 1992. The effect of these Orders will be to:

Carts Lane/Loseby Lane (No. 482).

Make permanent the experimental one-way traffic flow in:

- Carts Lane, from High Street to Silver Street in the direction of Silver Street.
- Loseby Lane, from Silver Street to St. Martins in the direction of St. Martins.

Nugent Street (No. 481):

Prohibit vehicles waiting between the hours of 7.30 a.m. and 6 p.m., Monday to Friday inclusive, except for permitting loading for a period of 20 minutes, in:

Nugent Street, the north side, between points 32 metres and 64 metres north-east of its junction with Tyrrell Street.

If you wish to question the validity of the Order or of any provisions contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or any Instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order you may within 6 weeks from 4th November 1992 apply to the High Court for this purpose.
