

Main Street (Unclassified County Road), west side, from the termination point of the existing waiting prohibition at the junction with the B6265 for a distance of 284 metres north-east to the junction with Chapel Street (the northern boundary of No. 2 Chamber End Fold).

Main Street (Unclassified County Road), east side, from the termination point of the existing waiting prohibition at the junction with Garrs Lane for a distance of 173 metres south-west to the termination point of the existing waiting prohibition at the north end of The Square.

Main Street (Unclassified County Road), east side, from the termination point of the existing waiting prohibition at the north end of The Square for a distance of 41 metres south-west along the west side of The Square to the junction with the south end of the square.

Main Street/The Square (Unclassified County Road), east side, from the termination point of the existing waiting prohibition at the junction with B6265 for a distance of 91 metres north-east to the termination point of the existing waiting prohibition at the junction with Gills Fold.

The Square (Unclassified County Road), east side, from the termination point of the existing waiting prohibition at the north end of The Square for a distance of 47 metres south-west to the junction with Main Street.

A copy of the Order which comes into operation on 11th November 1992 together with a map showing the roads affected may be examined at County Hall, Northallerton and at No. 10 Highways Divisional Office, Snaygill, Skipton BD23 2QR, during normal office hours.

If you wish to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained in it, on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act, or of any Instrument made under it, has not been complied with in relation to the Order, you may, within 6 weeks of 10th November 1992, make application to the High Court for the purpose.

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1990, SECTION 257

Leicester City Council (Blickling Walk) Public Path Order 1992

Notice is hereby given that the above-named orders (hereinafter referred to as "the Orders") made on 10th November 1992, is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed by the Leicester City Council as unopposed Orders.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification, will be to extinguish that part of the public right of way known as:

Blickling Walk

Blickling Walk, running from 17 metres south of Hastings Road to Bramall Road, a distance of 75 metres, 2.5 metres wide.

Corshaw Walk

Corshaw Walk, running from Waddesdon Walk to Morton Walk, a distance of 75 metres, 2.5 metres wide, and to create alternative footpaths in lieu, running:

- (1) from Waddesdon Walk to Brighton Road, for a distance of approximately 50 metres and;
- (2) from Brighton Road to Morton Walk, for a distance of approximately 27 metres.

Dorfold Walk

Dorfold Walk, running from Holkham Avenue to 48 metres south, and 2.5 metres wide.

Waddesdon Walk

Waddesdon Walk, running from Holkham Avenue to 68 metres south, 2.5 metres wide, and to create an alternative footpath in lieu, running from Buscott Close to Waddesdon Walk, for a distance of approximately 18 metres.

Morton Walk, Part 1

Morton Walk, running from 23 metres east of Buckland Road to 106 metres east of Buckland Road, a distance of 83 metres, and 2.5 metres wide.

Morton Walk, Part 2

Morton Walk, running from Hastings Road to 200 metres north-west, and 2.5 metres wide.

A copy of the Order, and of the map contained in it, has been deposited at the Legal Services Division, 5th Floor 'A' Block, New Walk Centre, Welford Place, Leicester, and may be inspected, free of charge, during office hours.

Any representation or objection with respect to the Order may be sent in writing to the Head of Legal Services at the address above, no later than 10th December 1992, and should state the grounds on which it is made.

If no objections or representations are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, the Leicester City Council may, instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State for confirmation, themselves confirm the Order as an unconfirmed Order.

If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State for confirmation, any representation or objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn, will be sent to the Secretary of State with the Order.
